EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Although we are prepared to handle all types of emergencies, the Beachwood Safety Services stress the importance of having your own emergency plan.

Make a plan. Your family may not be together when disaster strikes. How will you contact one another? If you can't get back to your home, where will you meet? Keep in mind, cell phones may not work.



Here are a few basics:

- Keep first aid kits at home and in car.
- Stock food, water and other supplies to last for at least 72 hours.
- Organize family medical information. Include a list of medications and dosages.
- Obtain training in emergency first aid and CPR.
- Teach children how and when to dial 911.
- Have working flashlights and know where they are located.
- Check smoke and CO detectors.

FERTILIZER SAFETY

When fertilizing, please make sure fertilizer stays on the lawn and is cleaned from the sidewalks, driveways and streets. State law mandates this for safety purposes.

Nobody wants chemicals tracked into their homes, or worse yet, nobody wants them to be absorbed in their bodies because they were wearing open shoes.

Chemicals can pose a health threat to pets. It is a violation of Ohio Pesticide Law if you do not remove granules from previously mentioned locations.
