ARBOR DAY IN BEACHWOOD

The City of Beachwood has earned the honor of "Tree City USA" for the 17th consecutive year for its commitment to effective urban forest management. The award is given by the Arbor Day Foundation.

To earn this recognition, a city must have a tree board, a tree-care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation. "The City of Beachwood's longtime commitment to urban forestry reflects the importance we place on trees and their vital role in our community," said Mayor Merle S. Gorden. "Trees benefit the health of our residents, our environment and our economy. This honor further enhances our efforts to become a more sustainable, eco-friendly city."

As a Tree City USA community, the City of Beachwood is providing cleaner air, improved storm water management, energy savings and increased property values.



BEACHWOOD FIRE-RESCUE RECAP

Beachwood Fire-Rescue is committed to providing the highest level of public safety service. In 2012:

- Emergency medical calls accounted for 70% of our total run volume.
- We assisted neighboring communities 97 times for emergency medical calls.
- Neighboring communities assisted us 87 times with emergency calls.
- 3,327 patients were treated by our emergency medical team.
- Beachwood transports to any hospital within a tri county area if the patient is stable.
- Beachwood paramedics received 1,112 hours of training.
- The busiest hours for our rescue squads is between 7:00 am and 11:00 pm and the busiest hours for fire calls is between 8:00 am and 6:00 pm.
- Our fire department responded to 1365 fire related calls.
- We had 11 structure fires.
- We responded to 53 fire calls in neighboring towns.
- Neighboring communities assisted us 23 times.
- Over 3,100 inspections and tests and were completed discovering over 3,600 violations.

WHAT GOES IN MY GREEN RECYCLING CART?

DO DEPOSIT:

Recyclables including:

- Paper, newspapers, magazines, office paper, chip board, phone books, junk mail
- Cardboard, cereal boxes
- Plastics #1 – 7
- Glass bottles and jars: clear, green and brown
- Cans: aluminum, tin and metal

DON'T DEPOSIT:

- Wax Coated/ Detergent Boxes
- Motor Oil *, Paint
- Hazardous Chemicals, Aerosol Cans

- Clothes Hangers, PVC Piping
- Light Bulbs, Window Glass, Drinking Glasses

CITY OF Beachwood RECYCLES



Materials placed in your green recycling cart can be loose or bagged. No sorting is needed. While you do not have to rinse containers before they are put in your recycling cart, you could opt to do so to avoid odors.

Empty items before placing them in cart and flatten boxes to save space.

Full dates. Items accepted during waste round ups: Acetone, Adhesives, Antifreeze, Automotive Fluids, Batteries, Fluorescent Bulbs, Gasoline, Household Cleaners, Kerosene, Lighter Fluid, Mercury, Mineral Spirits, Motor Oil, Oil or Solvent-Based Paint, Paint Thinner, Pesticides, Pool Chemicals, Primers, Polyurethanes, Roof Tar, Sealers, Shellacs, Spray Paint, Turpentine, Varnishes, Wood Killers (solid or liquid). Note: Latex Paint needs to be dried out and placed at curb on scheduled rubbish day.
