DOMINION EAST OHIO GAS LINE REPLACEMENT ON RICHMOND ROAD

Empty, Rinse, Replace Cap

CARTONS



Milk/Soup/Juice
Empty, Rinse, Replace Cap

NEW RECYCLING GUIDELINES

We provide weekly curbside recycling for our residents in single-family homes. For recycling efforts to be effective, the following guidelines need to be followed. All items should be placed loose (unbagged) in the provided wheeled cart.

What Plastic Should I Recycle and What about Those Numbers?

Those numbers are actually resin codes used by the plastics industry to identify the type of plastic. They do not always mean that the item is recyclable. Instead, we now look at the shape of container to decide if something is recyclable. And it is simpler than you think.

We can recycle any plastic container that is shaped like a bottle, jar, jug or tub. These comprise most of the plastic packaging that we bring home from the store and are accepted in all curbside and drop-off recycling programs in Cuyahoga County.

DO NOT include the following in your curbside recycling:

- Fruit & Lettuce Containers/Trays
- Produce, Deli & Bakery Trays
- Plastic Bags, Wraps, Film
- Cups (Solo cups, coffee cups)
- Utensils & Plates
- Fast Food Containers & Cups, Take-Out Containers (styrofoam & molded plastic)
- Bulky plastic (lawn chairs, crates, buckets Little Tikes...)
- Clothes hangers, toys, flower pots, straws
- Styrofoam
