

DISPATCH

During 2020, the Beachwood Dispatch Center, along with the rest of the world, faced new challenges related to the pandemic. Throughout the year, the dispatchers quickly adapted to changes in procedure which were modified as updated information was received. In total, the dispatch center received 58,780 incoming calls with an average answer time of 2.8 seconds.

Plans to incorporate additional entities into the dispatch center are still underway.

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2020 there were five hundred thirty-two (532) motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police Department. One hundred thirty-one (131), occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were fifty-one (51) accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not feel it was a matter worth reporting to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other reasons, it was decided that a report should be filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There was a total of four hundred one (401) on street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2020. Of the four hundred one (401) on street accidents one hundred thirty-five (135) involved personal injury, with one hundred eighty-six (186) involved persons claiming injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There was zero (0) fatal crashes in 2020.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in one hundred ninety-seven crashes (197). In 2020, seventy-four (74) drivers were issued citations for Failure to Maintain an Assured Clear Distance Ahead. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and it is our opinion that many crashes are directly related to driver inattention and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on forty-five (45) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations. A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 6 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 10 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes
- 0 citations issued for Failure to Yield to an emergency vehicle

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on thirty-eight (38) reports.

Failure to control was listed as the causative factor on forty-nine (49) reports.

Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on thirteen (13) reports.

Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on sixty-six (66) reports.

INTERSTATE ROUTE 271

The following crash activity occurred on IR-271 northbound & southbound and includes all exit and entrance ramps in the City of Beachwood.

1. On IR-271 northbound local lanes, 14 reported crashes.
2. On IR-271 northbound express lanes, 3 reported crashes.
3. On IR-271 northbound exit to Chagrin Blvd., 9 reported crashes.
4. On IR-271 southbound local lanes, 33 reported crashes.
5. On IR-271 southbound express lanes, 8 reported crashes.
6. On IR-271 southbound entrance ramp from Cedar, 1 reported crash.
7. On IR-271 southbound exit ramp to Chagrin, 5 reported crashes.
8. On IR-271 southbound exit ramp to Harvard, 3 reported crashes.

Assured clear distance was the most frequently listed causative factor in these crashes (74) followed by other violations (6). Many of these crashes are a direct result of speed that was excessive for the conditions and driver inattention.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost everyday. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2020, the police department received four hundred twenty-three (423) traffic complaints (as defined above) called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as e-mail.

Applicable complaints were posted in a "traffic special attention" file and via e-mail where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2020, officers logged fifty-seven (57) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red-light violations.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2020 the Beachwood Police Department made thirty-seven (37) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Twenty-five (25) of the arrested were male violators and twelve (12) were female violators.

Nineteen (19) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .162 which is just over twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .234, which is just under three (3) times the legal limit. Eleven (11) persons refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Due to different reasons or circumstances, eight (8) persons were requested to provide blood samples. One person refused to submit to a requested blood test. Six (6) were found to be over the legal limit or had been using drugs of abuse.

Twelve (12) of the violators had at least two (2) prior conviction. Four (4) violators had two (2) prior convictions and six (6) violators had more than two prior convictions. A total of one (1) violators were charged with felony O.V.I. violations in 2020. There were three (3) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2020.

The bulk of O.V.I. arrests were made between midnight and 4:00 AM (18). The busiest days of the week for O.V.I. activity were early Saturday morning and late Sunday night which is not a regular trend. The months of Jan-Feb had the most number of arrests with fourteen (14). The roadways with the highest number arrests were Chagrin with eleven (11), IR 271 with nine (9), Richmond Road with six (6), and Cedar Road with four (4).

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 1,016 traffic stops in 2020 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were fourteen (14) speeding citations issued, thirty-seven (37) assured clear distance ahead citations, eight (8) red light citations, four (4) vehicle registration violations, one (1) stop sign violations, and nineteen (19) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. No tickets were issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued five (5) written warnings and one thousand fourteen (1014) verbal warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received but not at the expense of ignoring other criminal activity trends.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often times the officer spend 20-30 minutes and records that "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

At one time the Beachwood Police Traffic Bureau was assigned the task of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (40) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood.

The monitoring of traffic signals was done on a daily basis by a central traffic computer located in the traffic bureau. That system has been removed from the traffic bureau and is now maintained by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centracs. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to one hundred-one (101) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2020.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2020, the traffic bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2020 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company received an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Interstate Towing and Rich's Towing are equipped to handle large vehicle tows of semi-trucks and trailers and heavy equipment. Tow companies were authorized to charge \$135 for a standard tow (additional fees for extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$25 per day for storage.

In 2020 there were three hundred ninety-seven (397) vehicles towed, this included forty-one (41) private tows. Private tows are those that the police may have called for at the request of the driver but no further police action was taken.

Twenty-two (22) vehicles were unclaimed and scrapped in 2019 with numerous other vehicles still being processed to be scrapped in accordance with Ohio law.

INVESTIGATIONS

DETECTIVE BUREAU/ JUVENILE DIVISION

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau spent the majority of 2020 completing fraud, sexual assault and other investigations that require extensive follow-up. With the Covid-19 pandemic closings and/or restricting most of the businesses as well as the court system for much of the year, the case load was less than normal. However, the detective bureau responded to investigate two separate shootings at Beachwood Place Mall in 2020. In both cases, the shooting suspect was apprehended and charged with felonious assault.

The detective bureau participated in Operation Autumn Hope which was a four day human trafficking detail that took place throughout the state of Ohio. The total state wide statistics for the four day operation were 71 arrests, 18 human trafficking victims rescued, 48 human trafficking victims referred to social services and 62 at risk juveniles were rescued.

The detective bureau personnel completed background investigations for the open patrol officer positions.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

In 2020, there was four incidents determined to be internal affairs complaints.

Of the four complaints, three were investigated and determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department protocol. The last complaint involved a Beachwood Police Officer that was off duty and subsequently arrested by the Ohio State Highway Patrol for operating a vehicle while intoxicated. The officer resigned from the police department prior to the internal investigation being initiated.

Overall, there was a decrease in the amount of internal affairs complaints from the prior year.

TRAINING

2020 was the first full year that Officer Jamey Appell took on the responsibilities as the Training Coordinator. Officer Appell provided internal training for the department. Several other officers who are certified in the necessary skills also provided internal training to Beachwood Police Officers

Beachwood Officers attended numerous training classes during 2020 under numerous COVID restrictions. Many courses were canceled because of COVID concerns. Like 2019, The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission again did not mandate any hours of continuing professional training (CPT) requirements. Numerous officers are members of the Eastside Departments Enforcement Group (E.D.G.E.) teams including Mobile Field Force, S.W.A.T., Crisis Negotiators, Accident Investigation Unit & Bomb Team. The S.W.A.T. team trains 16 hours every month plus 1 full week per year. The other teams typically train 8 hours per month. These teams/units service six municipalities.

One Beachwood Police Officer is a member of the Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team. The team meets numerous times a year for internal training. This unit services 13 municipalities.

The Police Department teamed-up with the Fire Department to train officers and fireman in the Rescue Task Force/Active Shooter concept. One scenario based trainings was held at Beachwood Police Department which involved officers responding to an active shooter in a school setting. This satisfied the active threat requirement of the training policy. All officers who attended the scenario based training were provided a review of the Department's Use-of Force policy.

CANINE

In 2020, both K9 teams successfully completed yearly recertification in March through The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission. A bite suit was purchased for training usage and has greatly increased the ability of the teams to train in apprehension scenarios. Throughout the year, deployments and training opportunities decreased due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Yearly departmental patrol familiarization as well as a 3 day training seminar had to be postponed due to the pandemic. K9 Kai was deployed a total of twelve times with six narcotics detection deployments and six patrol deployments. Three of the deployments were for neighboring agencies. K9 Jorik was deployed a total of nine times with three explosives detection deployments and six patrol deployments. Three of the patrol deployments were for neighboring agencies, one of which K9 Jorik assisted with safely locating a suicidal juvenile female in Pepper Pike. K9 Jorik assisted Beachwood Officers in three separate arrests involving reported armed suspects, which significantly reduced the need to apply force and provided an extra measure for officer safety. The K9 teams continue to be a beneficial asset to the department.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel were involved in ten (10) reportable use-of-force incidents during 2020. That force was used by personnel for defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, and to affect lawful arrests. When considering the thousands of encounters agency personnel have with the public annually in various contexts, this number is low. The definition of a “reportable use of force” by department policy is as follows:

An incident in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force:

- To compel a person to comply with the employee’s directions, or efforts to gain control
- To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention
- To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect
If/when that force employed results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or “control holds” to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect’s hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Deadly force, as defined by agency policy, is that force which under the circumstances in which it is applied is readily capable of causing death or serious bodily injury.

A Taser conducted energy weapon was deployed in five of the ten reportable use of force instances reviewed. In one incident, an officer on a mutual aid assignment to the City of Cleveland assigned to a multi-agency field force team deployed a pepper ball launcher at the direction of field force command staff. There were no instances in which deadly force was deployed by agency personnel in 2020. In almost all cases, there were multiple officers present during each application of force.

Physical injuries to agency personnel and subjects were minor when reported, and consisted mainly of scrapes, bruises, and aggravations of prior, existing injuries. All incidents reviewed were determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while also meeting the legal standard of objective reasonableness. The following are brief descriptions of the incidents where force was applied by agency personnel and the circumstances surrounding them.

01/30/2020

Report #20000422

Plain clothes and uniformed officers intercepted two theft suspects after they exited the Dillard's Department Store at Beachwood Place and attempted to enter a parked motor vehicle. The male suspect ignored verbal commands from police and began to walk away while the female suspect complied. The male subject resisted officers and was escorted to the ground where he was eventually handcuffed. Both suspects were taken into custody without further incident and charged with applicable statute violations.

02/26/2020

Report #20009023

Officers responded to Beachwood Place for a reported theft offense. While in route to the location, additional reports were received that the suspect was physically fighting with a uniformed Beachwood Police officer working an off-duty security detail. The initial arriving back-up officer discovered that the suspect had fought off the initial attempt to apprehend him and escaped into the mall. The suspect was again observed, a foot chase ensued and the subject was tackled to the ground where he continued to assault police personnel and attempt to escape. A Taser conducted energy weapon was deployed successfully causing incapacitation after which the subject was taken into custody without further incident.

02/28/2020

Report #20009368

An officer on patrol at Beachwood Place conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for illegal window tint and suspected drug activity after a canine provided a positive narcotics alert upon the vehicle while parked unoccupied. The driver refused to comply with repeated commands to exit his vehicle and subsequently fled from the traffic stop. A Taser conducted energy weapon was deployed upon the driver in an attempt to gain compliance and prevent his flight, however it is unknown if the Taser darts impacted the driver or had any effect. The driver was not apprehended.

04/21/2020

Report #20015267

Officers responded to a private residence for three separate 911 calls from an occupant within. Each time officers responded they were confronted with a non-cooperative person. On the third response, officers entered the residence to confirm the welfare of all within after dispatchers communicated that additional sounds and voices heard on the 911 call were indicative of an ongoing disturbance. Upon checking the house, an adult female was located hiding in a bedroom closet under a blanket in an attempt to conceal herself. The female ignored verbal commands to show her hands and exit, and then struggled and fought with officers as they attempted to secure her in handcuffs due to the uncertainty of what was occurring in the home and the volatility of others on-scene. The female was subsequently arrested without further incident at the conclusion of the investigation.

05/24/2020

Report #200018499

Officers and paramedics responded to the parking lot of Piada Restaurant for reports of a female in psychiatric crisis. Dispatch received a 911 call from the subject's mother who was attempting to transport her to Ahuja Hospital for a psychiatric intervention due to self-harming behavior. The subject had reportedly jumped out of the moving car and was located in the Piada Restaurant by the initial arriving officer. She was uncooperative with officers, ignored their verbal commands and attempts to speak with her, re-entered her mother's vehicle, and then refused to exit. After attempts to de-escalate and reason with the subject by multiple police and fire personnel failed, an officer deployed a Taser conducted energy weapon in drive stun mode to cause the subject to release her grasp of the vehicle's interior so that she could be removed from the car without injury. She was subsequently conveyed to Ahuja Hospital for a psychiatric evaluation without further incident.

05/30/2020

Report #20030804

Multiple Beachwood Police officers assigned to the EDGE Mobile Field Force unit were deployed to the City of Cleveland on a mutual aid assignment in response to the civil unrest that was occurring downtown. An officer assigned as a grenadier on a pepper ball launcher deployed pepper balls at various points during that unit's response to control crowd movements and disperse rioters under the direction of field force command staff. None of the pepper balls deployed by Beachwood personnel were determined to have impacted any person directly following an investigation into the unit's response.

06/30/2020

Report #20023131

Officers responded to a private residence after the county central communications center (CECOMS) received a 911 call from a hysterical female. Upon arrival, officers were greeted by the frantic caller who advised that she believed her husband had stabbed himself. Upon entry into the home, officers were confronted by a male holding a large, kitchen knife. The male fled into an adjoining room moving in and out of their sight while ignoring repeated commands to drop the knife. One of the responding officers transitioned from his firearm to his Taser conducted energy weapon which was successfully deployed and incapacitated the male so that he could be disarmed and secured in handcuffs. The male was subsequently conveyed to an emergency room for a psychiatric evaluation without further incident.

08/24/2020

Report #20029479

Officers were dispatched to the public library in response to a complaint from staff regarding an adult female who was refusing to comply with the facial covering requirements spurred by the COVID-19 pandemic. The female was engaged by officers and asked to leave multiple times per the request of staff. She continued about her business ignoring officers' lawful orders. When they attempted to escort her from the library, she squared up to the male officer in a fighting stance. The officer advised her that she was under arrest, and attempted to take her into custody. She struggled violently with arresting officers culminating in a ground fight on the library floor. Prior to being secured in handcuffs, the subject bit the male officer and injured the female officer's arm. The subject was probated due to homicidal threats and later charged criminally.

11/19/2020

Report #20040187

Officers responded to the city jail for an inmate attacking a corrections officer. The inmate punched the corrections officer in her face and was still grappling with corrections personnel upon the first police officer's arrival into the jail. The inmate refused to comply with orders and to be handcuffed and was subsequently subjected to a Taser conducted energy weapon deployment which incapacitated him and allowed him to be secured. The inmate was conveyed to Ahuja Hospital for an evaluation and was believed to be under the influence of narcotics he had ingested earlier in the day.

12/19/2020

Report #20043759

Officers were dispatched to the city jail for a physical confrontation between a corrections officer and an inmate. Upon police officer arrival, the inmate was still grappling with the corrections officer. Minor injuries were sustained by a police sergeant, both corrections personnel, and the inmate who had been confronted about his refusal to wear a face mask in the day room of the jail. The inmate was charged additionally with assault on a corrections officer.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

There were only two (2) incidents in 2020 that met the criteria for a high speed pursuit. Hot pursuit is defined by policy as: an active attempt by one or more police units to apprehend a suspect operating a motor vehicle, while the suspect is trying to avoid capture by using high speed driving or other evasive tactics such as driving off a highway, making sudden or unexpected movements, or maintaining legal speed but willfully failing to yield to the officer's signal to stop. Both of the agency pursuits were evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

03/10/2020

Report #20011112

Officers responded to reports of a carjacking in the parking lot of Beachwood Place. Responding officers located the stolen vehicle heading eastbound on Cedar Road. The suspect having observed the police car immediately fled in the stolen vehicle at a high rate of speed while disobeying multiple traffic control signals. The violator entered IR-271 southbound and a vehicle pursuit ensued. After confirmation was received that the victim of the robbery was unharmed, the pursuit was terminated by a shift supervisor due to safety concerns.

06/29/2020

Report #20022917

An officer in plain clothes and an unmarked vehicle was assisting the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office with surveilling an apartment complex for an individual wanted on felony charges and associated with a search warrant service to be conducted on that date. Prior to the arrival of sheriff's deputies, the subject left the complex and was tailed by the plain clothes officer who summoned uniform personnel in marked cars to attempt to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle and detain the wanted subject for responding deputies. The male fled from the uniformed officers. Due to the identity of the fleeing subject being known, the shift officer ordered termination of the pursuit.

ILLEGAL PROFILING REPORT

A fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States to all who live in this nation is the equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. Citizens are free to walk and drive our streets, highways, and other public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. They also are entitled to be free from crime, and from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This law enforcement agency is charged with protecting these fundamental rights for all, regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, age, physical or mental handicap, religion or other belief system, and/or classification or group affiliation.

The purpose of the illegal profiling policy is to unequivocally state that illegal profiling in law enforcement is totally unacceptable, to provide guidelines for officers to prevent such occurrences, and to protect our officers when they act within the dictates of the law and policy from unwarranted accusations. Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties to provide transparency and protect themselves from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner, to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances, and to actively enforce the motor vehicle laws, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe they have committed, are committing, or are about to commit an infraction of the law or when the situation leads an officer to believe that a person may need some type of assistance. To that end, members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in various topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion or police action is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to verify that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law.

The following aspects of officer activity were examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in warnings
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers issued approximately 800 citations in 2020. This was a substantial drop from recent years and directly correlated to efforts to practice social distancing and limit unnecessary exposures of police personnel to the public. Those citations resulted from traffic stops, responses to and investigations of traffic crashes, investigations into criminal matters, as well as other law enforcement encounters. Of those citations, 44.86% were issued to individuals identified as being white, 49.93% as being African-American, approximately 1.17% as being Asian, and 4.03% as being of other races or their race was not known or noted by the issuing officer. Of those citations issued, 53.97% were issued to males and 46.03% were issued to females. There were nearly 500 total warnings for various infractions issued, most all being verbal in nature.

The agency received no substantiated complaints of racial profiling in 2020

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor Offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2020, 644 traffic and 17 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 319 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2020, Mayor's Court transferred 59 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 542 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2020, 546 people were processed in the Beachwood City Jail, 334 males and 212 females. We housed 48 people for the City of Pepper Pike who contracts with the City of Beachwood for jail services. We also housed 4 people as time servers and an additional 5 people for other cities on a mutual aid basis. Beachwood officers arrested 489 people for crimes in Beachwood. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 54 juveniles that were processed in juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 5 of those juveniles were transported to their facility. Juvenile arrests decreased by 41 from 2019 and adult arrests decreased by 552 from 2019. The dramatic drop in the number of arrests is attributed to the Covid-19 Pandemic that lasted throughout the year.

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail has remained relatively constant since 2017.

In 2020, 48 people were housed for the City of Pepper Pike which resulted in the revenue of \$6,980.00. The housing of prisoners for other cities, with a contract or by mutual aid, will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected.

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, did not perform a physical inspection of the Beachwood City Jail in 2020. A self-audit was conducted on a limited number of standards. After review by the Bureau of Adult Detention, the Beachwood City Jail was found to be in compliance with those standards.

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state standards. As noted above, a limited self-audit inspection was conducted and approved by the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention. In addition, the fire department and county health officials inspected the jail and found no deficiencies. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. No staff members or inmates sustained serious injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

Police Mountain Bike Unit

The police mountain bike unit was staffed in 2020 as a part-time unit. Due to certified mountain bike unit members being reassigned to K9 and SPEAR assignments, the team was reduced to five patrol officers in 2020. There were four officers appointed to replace created vacancies, however certification class cancellations due to the worldwide pandemic prohibited those officers from attaining their proper training. These officers will all receive their certification training in Spring 2021.

The focal areas of deployment for the unit have been the City Park properties, the Beachwood Family Aquatic Center, Beachwood Place Mall, special events in the City, and residential side streets. Forced closures to the City Park and special City events due to the pandemic reduced the impact of the unit for 2020, as there were much less opportunities to publicly interact with the general public at such festivities. The unit operates on a twenty four hour basis when call volume and manpower allows.

Bicycles are either transported by police vehicle to target areas where they are then deployed, or they are ridden by the bicycle officer from the police station. Bicycle officers are expected to respond to nearly all calls of service while on bike patrol, with some notable exceptions such as incidents on the freeway where responding on a bicycle is not allowed.

The bicycle unit has proven to be a valuable tool for the department in terms of public relations, becoming familiar with nuances of the area, and a more quiet and stealth like ability to detect and prevent crime. There are four fully operational and equipped bicycles available for patrol at all times.

Field Training Officers

The Beachwood PD Field Training Officer (FTO) program did not train any new officers in 2020 due to COVID19. The program assigned four new field training officers. The program is currently staffed with ten active veteran certified training officers and led by one supervisor who is also certified as a field training officer. Two of the four new FTOs went to a certified training school in 2020. The other two FTOs were already certified.

The FTO program is expected to train five to eight new officers in 2021. The training curriculum was updated and written tests were implemented for important training subjects. The curriculum was also standardized giving the FTO specific guidance to what needs to be trained by giving them a policy, procedure, or resource to train with the new officer.

SCHOOLS

This report will explain what The City of Beachwood Police Department and associated Officers have accomplished in the Beachwood City School System. The report will address areas and issues that the Officers are currently working to improve, and any recommendations.

Background and beginning of the program

The agreement was made between the City and the School Board for police officers to work in schools. This took effect on August 1, 2015 and was renewed as of August 1, 2018

There have been two changes in officer assignment or duties, they are listed below. All of the officers have worked and rotated through all of the schools. This was done so that all of the officers would be familiar with the layout and daily operation of all of the School District's buildings. Once familiarity was established, it was agreed that officers would be assigned to one building. By assigning an officer to a building this allowed the officer to specifically know the daily operation of a building and its occupants.

While on duty school officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, watch security cameras, monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches. With all due respect and clarity, it would take too much time and space to list everything that officers do, have done, or are willing to do while working at the schools.

Fairmount School / B.O.E

Officers assigned to building: Officer Brian Steele

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0845 hrs.
- 0900 – 0930 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1200 – 1230 hrs. Officers will monitor early student dismissal.
- 1500 – 1505 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at the Fairmount School Building, the situation has been very positive. All of the parents and students that we interact with have nothing but praise for police officers being at the schools. Officers have done well proactively recognizing areas of concern and addressing those issues. The front office assistant and the preschool staff are very cognizant of building security and are quick to report anything that is out of place. Officers are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates. Officer Clark was not requested to return to work at the schools when school returned in September of 2020. Officer Steele has been working a majority of the shifts at this building. On Officer Steele's days off, other officers cover the shift in that building.

Bryden School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Tom Powers, Officer Tim Gerding

Police officer basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0830 hrs.
- 0830 – 0845 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, and classes specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1515 – 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at Bryden School many positive changes have been made. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are organized and take great concern over all of the safety drills. Bryden School is in serious need of more, higher definition, security cameras as well as a more workable entry point for visitor/staff interaction. Proposals have been made to consolidate Bryden and Hilltop with Fairmount School making one big elementary school. That would be a tremendous advantage from a safety and security standpoint. In the meantime, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing their attention on them. After school care was cancelled due to covid. Officers at Bryden School are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates.

Hilltop School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Jerome Hall, Officer Pete Messina

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0800 hrs.
- 0805 – 0825 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1425 – 1445 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned to Hilltop School many positive changes have been made. The addition of officers has greatly improved the safety of students, staff, and visitors attending Hilltop. Hilltop School is in need of more, higher definition security cameras. Similar to last school year, one new high definition camera and 2 repurposed cameras have been added to the camera system at Hilltop to combat the shortage of cameras at this school. Similar to Bryden School, Hilltop is in need of a more workable entry point for visitors/staff interaction, but as mentioned above I am hopeful for a consolidation. Again, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing attention on them. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are on task with the State mandated requirements for safety drills. Hilltop School, because of the baseball fields, and setting of the park-like playground, draws a lot of after hour visitors. Although the patrol division actively patrols the school parking lot, additional security cameras would deter unwanted activity.

Middle School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Anthony Thomas.

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0740 hrs.
 - From 0745 - 0815 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
 - Patrol school grounds
 - Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
 - Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1530 – 1540 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Several changes have been applied to the Middle School this year. School hours were adjusted due to the covid pandemic. Officer Turner retired in January 2020, leaving Officer Thomas as the lone officer assigned to the Middle School. On Officer Thomas' day's off, other officers fill in to cover the Middle School. Officer Turner's absence dramatically affects scheduling. Out of all of the buildings in the district, the Middle School has the most security cameras, per building size. There are high definition cameras focused on the parking lot and entry points of the school. Inside cameras are well placed and cover a majority of the school. The Middle School has already completed all of the State mandated school safety drills.

High School

Officer assigned to the building: Officer C.J. Piro

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- From 0705 - 0820 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1500 – 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Beachwood High School is an extremely busy building. It hosts 3 different Excel Tecc programs bringing in students from several different school districts. These vocational and learning opportunities, while all three programs are still running, the school restaurant was closed due to the covid pandemic. The Principal, Mr. Chase and Assistant Principal, Mr. Patti, have had previous experience working with a Police Officer in the schools. They have a very good understanding of when and how to involve the police. . They consistently inform me of any issues. They handle all of the school matters without police interaction, but will not hesitate to involve the police when needed. The high school has completed all of the school safety drills. Since beginning work at the high school, tighter security procedures were instituted. The staff has responded well to officers in the building, and with the approval of Mr. Patti and Mr. Chase, I continue to speak to classes about current law enforcement and school related topics. All of the evening sporting events have an officer detailed to provide security. Officers have now been requested to travel to away sporting events as well as chaperone school trips.

Closing

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place. Every building is more secure. Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have gone well in all of the schools. School Police Officers have trained "active threat drills" in our own buildings. As an improvement from the previous school year, the district has purchased security cameras. While most of the buildings had some of the same shortcomings relating to CCTV cameras, the purchase of new cameras demonstrates that the District takes safety and security seriously and are taking steps to remediate those issues.

All of the principals have mutual goals and are extremely easy to work with. Every building's administration has open lines of communication with the police officers. They provide feedback and ideas when implementing new security measures. I have regular cadence meetings scheduled with each principal to ensure that any concerns are being addressed and remediated.

Beachwood Police Dispatch has recorded over 100 CR (calls responded to) incidents at school district buildings. Those calls were generated from both school police officers and road officers. The 100 recorded calls also included times when officers responded to District's buildings on weekends and when school was not in session. The calls requesting a police officer were primarily service type calls (alarms, vehicle lock-outs, premiss checks, rescue squad calls, etc.). Road patrol officers logged several school visits this year. The number of road patrol officers visiting the schools has increased every year since officers have been detailed to the schools. That is a very positive and needed thing. The more that patrol officers visit, the more familiar they will be with the layout and operation of the schools making the schools an overall safer place.

Having officers detailed to the schools has dramatically improved the relationship between the community and the police department. No matter what building you would observe, you would frequently see interaction between the students and the officers assigned to the buildings. At all of the schools, officers will be seen in the cafeteria during a portion of the lunch periods. Students will often ask the officers to join them for lunch. In the lower schools officers will be outside when students are on recess. In the upper schools officers are involved in classroom discussions. All of the officers have done classroom and safety presentations at all of the schools. With the permission of Dr. Hardis, I again presented at other schools outside of Beachwood, providing safety presentations to students and staff. While working sporting events it is not uncommon to see students from all of the schools introducing officers to their parents. Dr. Hardis also supports Beachwood School Officers working with officers from other school districts.

The covid pandemic has dramatically affected the operation of the schools, but officers have adapted well. The hours of operation for the Board of Education / Fairmount Pre-School, Bryden Elementary School, and Hilltop Elementary School were changed due to the Covid pandemic. The retirement of Officer Turner and the removal of Officer Clark definitely has affected the scheduling of officers to cover the buildings. My current staff and I have been very flexible, but even with our flexibility, the shortage of officers makes scheduling and extra detail coverage a very difficult task. Replacement of those officers should be addressed in a more timely manner.

The agreement to have officers detailed to the Beachwood City Schools is working well, and Officers look forward to continuing to protect and serve in the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

THE MISSION FOR EVERY MEMBER OF THE BEACHWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT IS TO CONSISTENTLY SEEK AND FIND WAYS TO AFFIRMATIVELY PROMOTE, PRESERVE AND DELIVER A FEELING OF SECURITY, SAFETY AND QUALITY SERVICES TO MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

The Beachwood Police Department's community policing efforts play an important role in delivering "a feeling of security, safety and quality services to members of our community." When personnel provide services that may be oriented towards safety and security matters, educational or related to crime prevention and community relations, they are helping their customers feel more secure as well as more appreciative of the work of their public servants. These kinds of actions can lead to increased trust and harmony between police personnel and the public they serve. This mission was completed successfully in many ways. -

The Community Engagement Officers in 2020 was Officer Jamey Appell. There were 12 community-policing events documented in 2020. A few ALICE type presentations were held and lead by Officer Appell. Most of these presentations were held virtually. Active shooter events are still a real concern for businesses, schools and religious institutions alike. This area of concern for the community will be ongoing for the foreseeable future. Officer Appell was invited to be a panel Speaker for the ALICE corporation annual employee meeting.

Many community events and programs were canceled because of COVID which included Safety Town, Mocktail, Senior Academy. The Beachwood Police Facebook page was utilized again to provide members of the community with PSA's and important information.

Chief Stillman took over as Police Chief in Late September of 2020. Officer Appell and Chief Stillman met often to discuss new programs for 2020 and beyond. A few of the discussions were about implementing a Police Chaplain program and changing the Senior Academy to a Citizens Academy. A Citizens Academy would span the program to more age groups. Chief Stillman has a passion for training and community relations as does Officer Appell. This will serve the community well as we move forward with current and future endeavors



Calls Received by Month and Shift



Calls Received by Day of the Week and Shift For 2020






