

OHIO COLLABORATIVE POLICY

“The Ohio Collaborative, a 12-person panel of law enforcement experts and community leaders from throughout the state, established Ohio's first state law enforcement standards on August 28, 2015. These standards will hold everyone accountable and instill a greater confidence with the public. The Collaborative works closely with partners, including the community and law enforcement agencies, to implement new standards. All law enforcement agencies are expected to meet or exceed these standards as they develop policies and procedures to meet new expectations.”

The Ohio Collaborative consists of five groups. Each group contains policies to which each agency must show compliance by submitting supporting documents of each policy. In 2022, The Beachwood Police Department has obtained full certification in groups one through four, and we are currently provisionally certified in group five, awaiting final review and certification. The Beachwood Police Department will maintain our certification by submitting supportive documents to show continued compliance, each year.

DISPATCH

The Beachwood Dispatch Center is responsible for processing all 911 and non-emergency calls, as well as radio communications for police, fire, and emergency medical services for the communities of Beachwood and Pepper Pike.

In total, the dispatch center received 63,489 incoming calls, 10,078 of which were 911 calls. The average answer time for calls received was 2.8 seconds and 99.61% of all incoming calls were answered within 10 seconds.

Dispatcher Brian Moore was selected as a 2022 Beachwood Hometown Hero for his dedication to providing excellent customer service and for going above and beyond to ensure the safety of the residents and first responders in the cities of Beachwood and Pepper Pike. After 32 years of service with the City of Beachwood, Dispatcher Moore retired in September.

In October, the dispatch center implemented the use of Rapid SOS, an intelligent safety platform that provides location information and other safety related data for 911 calls received from cellular devices in our service area.

In November, Dispatcher Michelle Eles joined the Beachwood Dispatch team, coming to us from the City of Macedonia.

Plans to incorporate additional entities into the dispatch center are still underway.

TRAFFIC

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2022 there were six hundred ninety (690) motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police Department. One hundred seventy-one (171), occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were forty-six (46) accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not feel it was a matter worth reporting to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other reasons, it was decided that a report should be filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There was a total of five hundred nineteen (519) on street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2022. Of the five hundred nineteen (519) on street accidents one hundred thirty-one (131) involved personal injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There were zero (0) fatal crashes in 2022.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in two hundred twenty (220) crashes. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and many crashes are directly related to distracted driving and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on fifty-three (53) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations. A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 25 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 69 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on eighty-four (84) reports.

Failure to control was listed as the causative factor on sixty (60) reports.

Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on sixteen (16) reports.

Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on seventy-two (72) reports.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost everyday. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2022, the police department received four hundred twenty-six (426) traffic complaints (as defined above) called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as e-mail.

Applicable complaints were posted in a "traffic special attention" file and via e-mail where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2022, officers logged fifty-five (55) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red-light violations.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2022 the Beachwood Police Department made forty-eight (48) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Twenty-nine (29) of the arrested were male violators and nineteen (19) were female violators.

Twenty-five (25) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .175 which is over twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .269, which is over three (3) times the legal limit. Sixteen (16) persons refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Due to different reasons or circumstances, six (6) persons were requested to provide blood samples. Six (6) were found to be over the legal limit or had been using drugs of abuse.

Five (5) of the violators had at least one (1) prior conviction. Nine (9) of the violators had at least two (2) prior convictions. There were six (6) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2022.

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 2,515 traffic stops in 2022 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were six hundred forty (640) speeding citations issued, one hundred sixty-five (165) assured clear distance ahead citations, eighty-one (81) red light citations, two hundred eighty-two (282) vehicle registration violations, one hundred seven (107) stop sign violations, and one hundred ninety-two (192) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. One (1) citation was issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued one thousand eight hundred fifty-eight (1,858) citations, five (5) written warnings, and one thousand one hundred sixty (1,160) verbal warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often times the officer spends 20-30 minutes and records that "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

At one time the Beachwood Police Traffic Bureau was assigned the task of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (40) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood.

The monitoring of traffic signals was done on a daily basis by a central traffic computer located in the traffic bureau. That system is now maintained by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centrac. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to one hundred-ten (110) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2022.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2022, the traffic bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2022 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers use a rotation system to ensure that each company receives an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Tow companies are authorized to charge \$135 for a standard tow (additional fees for extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$25 per day for storage.

In 2022 there were seven hundred seventy-six (776) vehicles towed, this included fifteen (15) private tows. Private tows are those that the police may have called for at the request of the driver but no further police action was taken.

Twenty-six (26) vehicles were unclaimed and scrapped in 2022 with numerous other vehicles still being processed to be scrapped in accordance with Ohio law.

INVESTIGATIONS

Detective Bureau

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau consists of four full time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. One of the detectives was assigned to the SPEAR unit (Specialized Patrol Enforcement and Response) and work primarily late afternoon/evening hours. One of the detectives was assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau spent the majority of 2022 completing fraud, sexual assaults and other investigations that require extensive follow-up. The Detective Bureau also spent a considerable amount of time conducting background investigations for new police applicants while utilizing new software that allows for a more extensive investigation.

The SPEAR unit consists of one detective and two patrol officers including a K-9. This unit worked directly with the detective bureau to identify areas of concern throughout the city. The unit would then take a proactive response to not only deter crime but to quickly respond and react to anyone violating the law. This unit was frequently deployed at Beachwood Place which allowed the officers assigned to the patrol division to be available to respond to other calls for service as well as actively patrol the city.

The SPEAR and Detective Bureau decreased by one detective and one SPEAR officer from the prior year.

Internal Affairs

In 2022, there were three incidents determined to be internal affairs complaints.

Of the three complaints, two were investigated and determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department protocol. One complaint involved a Beachwood Police Officer that was having personal issues and required assistance and counseling.

It should be noted that the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office requested impeachment materials involving officers with a history of dishonesty or a lack of candor, or demonstration of bias. Internal Affairs documents as well as personnel file documents were turned over as required and the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office determined that (5) officers have impeachment evidence that must be disclosed to opposing council.

TRAINING

The following report contains training that took place both at the Beachwood Police Department as well as outside of the department in 2022. The training at the department was conducted by certified Beachwood PD Instructors in Firearms, Taser, PepperBall, PepperGel OC, ALICE, RTF, Subject Control, Emergency Vehicle Operations, SFST's, etc. The following contains the training that was received by various personnel at the Beachwood Police Department.

In addition to the listed training above, the Beachwood Police Department also has officers that are members of the Eastside Departments Group Enforcement (EDGE) teams including Mobile Field Force, SWAT, Crisis Negotiators, Accident Investigation Unit and Bomb Squad. The Bomb Squad and SWAT team trains 16 hours every month. The SWAT team also trains one full week per year. The other teams mentioned train eight hours per month. These teams/units service seven municipalities which include Beachwood, Bratenahl, Cleveland Heights, Euclid, Shaker Heights, South Euclid, and University Heights. The Beachwood Police Department also has a member on the Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team. This team meets several times a year for internal training. The team services thirteen municipalities.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

The Beachwood Police Department Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Program was created to provide resources and develop partnerships with the community, behavioral health care systems and advocacy groups to improve the department's relationship with the community. The program shall reflect the values of the community by promoting dignity and fairness to all through training, encounters with individuals in crisis, and community partnerships. The objective of the CIT Program is to connect or direct individuals and their families to health care resources that can provide prolonged stabilization and support. Our goals while achieving this include:

1. Assisting individuals in crisis, while demonstrating dignity and respect.
2. Improve the safety of officers, individuals in crisis, their family members, and the community.
3. Develop the foundation necessary to promote community solutions to assist individuals in crisis.
4. Reduce the need for individuals in crisis to have further involvement with the criminal justice system.

Beachwood Police Department coordinated with the Alcohol, Drug Addiction & Mental Health Services Board of Cuyahoga County to train all full time sworn officers with 40 hours of Crisis Intervention Team Training and Community Crisis Intervention Dispatch Training for all dispatchers. Beachwood Police Department responded to 323 incidents identified as Crisis Intervention Incidents in 2022.

RANGE

The yearly inspection of the Beachwood Police shooting range was completed by Sgt. Benjamin Bouw during the month of January, 2023 for the previous year. The following is a report of the findings:

Range Facility and Equipment: The range was professionally cleaned in January of 2023. The range's targeting system continues to be inoperable. The system is so antiquated that it would not be reasonable to have it repaired. The targets are able to slide by hand, and the Beachwood Service Department has cleaned and greased the tracks so that the targets move easily. The walls of the range were painted by the Service Department. All of the lights in the range have been upgraded to LED bulbs, and this has greatly increased the light in the range.

Qualification Records: The qualification records are all updated. All full-time and part-time officers that were required to qualify with a rifle and shotgun successfully qualified. Officers also all qualified with their duty handgun. All of the qualification records were scanned, and digital copies are saved in the Range folder on the Department drive. This was completed to help eliminate the paper clutter and to make it easier to find the records if requested years later. A goal for 2023 is to have all of the qualification forms digitally completed, signed, and saved. Records for ammunition purchases, firearm receipts, and turn-in records are scattered in multiple files and locations, and this issue will be rectified during 2023.

Ammunition: An inventory was taken of the different types of ammunition needed by the Department. At the time of the inventory, the only shortage of ammunition was of duty rounds for the rifles. All rifles in the vehicles are properly supplied, but the reserve supply is very limited. New duty ammunition will be ordered to supply the patrol rifles as the current duty ammunition is old. As training is conducted in 2023, more ammunition will be ordered for the other weapon systems used by the Department.

Expendable Supplies: There is a sufficient supply of targets, cardboard backers, eye protection, and hearing protection for the normal range activities. Additional supplies will be ordered in time for the yearly rifle qualifications. Some of the firearm cleaning supplies are wearing out, so replacements will need to be ordered. Additional equipment such as earplugs, staples, and disposable lead-removal hand wipes will also be ordered.

Non-Issued Duty Weapons: All of the non-issued duty weapons are accounted for. Extra, unassigned duty handguns are properly secured in the range vault. There are enough handguns and lights to accommodate any additional officers hired in 2023. Additional holsters will need to be ordered depending on the number of left or right-handed officers hired. SWAT rifles and shotguns are stored, either by SWAT officers in the SWAT truck, or in the vehicles and gun cabinet in the Sergeant's office. The monthly checks of the rifles will be re-started in 2023.

Confiscated or Donated Weapons: The supply of confiscated or donated weapons had been disposed of in the recent past, so there are only a few firearms currently accounted for and stored in the range vault.

Goals for 2023: There is a lot of clutter in the range of items that have no useful purpose, are broken, or belong to equipment the department no longer uses. The department intends to either dispose of the items that can be put in the garbage, or make arrangements to have items safely removed. As mentioned above, the qualification and training records will be all digital and will be able to be accessed and completed by all range instructors. The inventory and purchase records will also be scanned and stored in folders on the department drive. If manpower and inventory permits, the department would like to have, at least quarterly, all officers receive standard training programs completed by the range instructors on different handgun tactics and techniques.

CANINE

K9 Kai was deployed a total of 28 times with 16 narcotics detection deployments and 12 patrol deployments. Three of the deployments were for neighboring agencies. A total of 4.59Kg of various narcotics along with 210.5 pills (most testing as pressed fentanyl) were located and seized. K9 Kai assisted in the arrest of 12 individuals during the 12 patrol deployments. K9 Kai was an integral part of a narcotics investigation that resulted in the seizure of \$140,420, along with a substantial amount of narcotics, 2 firearms, and the arrests of two individuals for trafficking/weapons offenses. K9 Kai was also an integral part of multiple drug trafficking currency seizures. On 12/31/2022, K9 Kai assisted on a weapons violation call where a male pointed a firearm at another male inside of Saks Fifth Ave. After the suspect was in custody, K9 Kai completed an article search, locating the handgun the suspect had tossed into a wooded area outside the store.

K9 Jorik was deployed a total of 13 times with 6 explosives detection deployments, 2 patrol deployments and 5 community relations deployments. One of the deployments was for a neighboring agency. K9 Jorik provided security sweeps for several large scale events including the Israeli Independence Day celebration held at Temple Tifereth Israel. In October, K9 Jorik responded for an emergency call-out to conduct security sweeps of multiple Jewish institutions in Beachwood following suspicious behavior and comments made by a local male. K9 Jorik also assisted in the apprehension of a suspect who was reported to have broken into a residential home in Beachwood.

In March of 2022, both K9 teams successfully completed annual certifications with the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy and the North American Police Work Dog Association. The Beachwood K9 Unit continues to be an invaluable asset to patrol officers, the department and the community.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel were involved in six (6) reportable force incidents during 2022. The force employed was for defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, to affect custodial arrests, and to carry out their lawful duties. When considering the thousands of encounters agency personnel have with the public in varied contexts, this number is remarkably low. Agency policy defines force as *the application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.* Officers are entrusted to use that amount and duration of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer(s) at the time of the event to accomplish their law enforcement purpose. Personnel are expected to attempt to de-escalate situations prior to deploying force options whenever possible. In the event a force deployment is believed to be excessive or unreasonable, agency personnel bear the responsibility and duty to intercede and report their observations to supervisors.

The definition of a “reportable force” incident by department policy is one *in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force (including canine deployment):*

- *To compel a person to comply with the employee’s directions, or efforts to gain control;*
- *To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention;*
- *To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect*

When that force employed results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or “control holds” to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect’s hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Deadly force as defined by agency policy is that force which is *reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.*

There were no instances in which officer(s) deployed deadly force in 2022.

A Taser conducted energy weapon (device) was deployed in only one of the reportable use of force instances reviewed. In all but one case, there were multiple officers present during the application of force.

Physical injuries to agency personnel and subjects were minor when reported, and consisted mainly of scrapes, bruises, and aggravations of prior, existing injuries. All incidents reviewed were determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while also meeting the legal standard of objective reasonableness. The following are brief descriptions of the incidents that qualified as reviewable uses of force by agency personnel and the circumstances surrounding them.

01/25/2022

Report#22-003627

At 1922 hours, officers were dispatched to Dillard's at Beachwood Place for a reported theft. Upon the arrival of the initial officer, the suspect was located in the parking lot of the store holding the stolen merchandise. The suspect immediately began to retreat after being confronted by the officer and ignored lawful commands to stop. A foot pursuit ensued with the lone officer giving chase through the parking lot. After providing a verbal warning of his intent, the officer deployed his Taser CEW at the subject, but the Taser did not provide the intended effect. The subject was eventually tackled by the officer and taken into custody without further incident. The subject was transported to a local emergency room for the removal of the one dart probe that did penetrate his skin. The officer was unharmed, but a civilian loss prevention employee suffered minor injuries while attempting to aid the uniformed officer in the apprehension.

05/01/22

Report #22-017451

At 1650 hours, officers initiated a traffic stop in the parking lot of Beachwood Place on a vehicle bearing fictitious license plates and exhibiting illegal window tint. The driver of the vehicle refused to provide officers access to see the VIN plate of the vehicle which was purposely concealed. Officers attempted to place the driver under arrest for various offenses, but he refused to comply with verbal commands and tensed and straightened his arms in an attempt to prevent being handcuffed. The subject was escorted to the ground where he was taken into custody and secured without further incident. He was subsequently transported to a local emergency room for injuries he alleged were sustained during the arrest but left prior to even being evaluated by a physician. The vehicle was later determined to be stolen out of the state of New York.

8/13/2022

Report #22-033504

At 1112 hours, officers responded to an East Baintree Road residence for a 911 hang-up call with a female screaming in the background. While in route, officers were notified of alerts on the residence for the male occupant's prior attempts to self-harm and present a knife. Upon the arrival of officers, yelling from within the residence indicative of an altercation/emergency was on-going. The occupants did not answer the door which prompted the officers to make an exigent circumstance entry into the dwelling. After making entry, they discovered a male and female on a living room couch struggling over a large kitchen knife. The officers intervened and secured the knife while ordering the male to the ground. He failed to comply and was escorted to the ground, secured in handcuffs without further incident, and subsequently transported to a local emergency room.

10/10/2022

Report #22-041861

At 0028 hours, an officer conducted a traffic stop on Chagrin Boulevard after observing multiple traffic violations commonly associated with impaired driving. The officer's interaction at the violator's window confirmed his suspicion of impairment, and the motorist was asked to exit his vehicle to perform standardized field sobriety tests. The violator refused to exit his vehicle. Officers attempted to reason with the driver and assured him that he had the right to refuse to perform the roadside tests, but he did not have the right to refuse to exit his vehicle as the officer did not intend to allow him to continue driving due to his belief that he was impaired. Attempts to reason with the motorist, achieve voluntary compliance, and de-escalate the situation were fruitless. Officers were eventually forced to extract the motorist from the vehicle, and he was arrested without further incident.

11/23/2022

Report #22-047937

At 0151 hours, an officer conducted a traffic stop of a motor vehicle on Chagrin Boulevard. The driver was discovered to have a suspended operator's license and to be wanted on multiple arrest warrants. The driver refused to exit the vehicle and was eventually forcibly extracted and arrested after attempts to gain voluntary compliance were unsuccessful.

11/24/2022

Report #22-048154

At 2312 hours, an officer conducted a traffic stop on Cedar Road for traffic violations indicative of impaired driving. Those violations were confirmed after additional roadside testing was completed and the officer attempted to take the female motorist into custody. The female resisted arrest and the incident escalated into a mental health crisis with the subject attempting to self-harm. She was transported to a local emergency room for treatment.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

There were (3) incidents in 2022 that met the criteria for a vehicle pursuit and subsequent review. A vehicle pursuit is defined by the current agency policy as: *an event involving one or more peace officers attempting to apprehend a suspect who is trying to avoid arrest while operating a motor vehicle by using high speed or other evasive tactics, such as disregarding traffic warning signs, stop signs, red lights, driving off a roadway, turning suddenly or driving in a legal manner but willfully failing to yield to an officer's signal to stop.* All of the vehicle pursuits were evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

04/01/2022

Report #22-013011

At 0445 hours, Beachwood officers responded to IR-271 Southbound to render assistance to the Wickliffe Police Department. A sole officer from that agency was pursuing a vehicle approaching city limits. A Beachwood officer engaged the pursuit to provide assistance to the lone pursuing officer. The fleeing vehicle continued through this city and beyond into the city of Solon where an officer from the Solon PD and an additional agency entered the pursuit. At that time, the Beachwood officer ended his participation and returned to the city. The driver was subsequently apprehended.

05/19/22

Report #22-020317

At approximately 2010 hours, a police officer on the property at Beachwood Place received a report from mall security that two shoplifting suspects had resisted detention for a theft offense at Dillard's. One of the subjects reportedly attempted to deploy pepper spray at the off-duty police officer working for Dillard's loss prevention to aid in their escape. The subjects entered a vehicle and left the property, but were spotted fleeing from the incident. An officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop, but the vehicle fled at a high rate of speed and disregarded a red traffic signal at the Richmond & Cedar intersection at which time the pursuit was terminated. The officer who had been threatened with the pepper spray was unharmed. The criminal suspect/driver of the vehicle was later identified and charged.

12/29/2022

Report #22-052848

At 0025 hours, officers were dispatched to the area of Chagrin Boulevard eastbound from Green Road after the dispatch center received an LPR alert in regards to a stolen vehicle taken at gunpoint entered by the Cleveland Police Department. Officers located the suspect vehicle and attempted to conduct a traffic stop upon it on Chagrin Boulevard near Brainard Road. The vehicle fled and a high speed vehicle pursuit ensued that traversed multiple municipalities. Beachwood officers terminated their attempts to stop the vehicle after officers from other agencies assumed the pursuit. The vehicle involved crashed a short time later in Northfield Village and all the vehicle occupants were apprehended.

BIAS-BASED POLICING

A fundamental right guaranteed by the constitutions of both this state and nation is equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by governmental agents. Citizens are free to move about in public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. All citizens are equally entitled to be free from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This agency is charged with protecting these fundamental rights and delivering the same law enforcement service for all, regardless of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, economic status, age, cultural group, disability, or affiliation with any non-criminal group.

The purpose of the bias-based policing policy is to strictly prohibit bias-based policing tactics as well as to affirm the agency's commitment to policing that is fair and objective. The policy outlines responsibilities for agency members, supervisory personnel, and the administration. Nothing in the policy is intended to prohibit personnel from considering protected characteristics in combination with other credible information in furtherance of their legitimate law enforcement objectives.

Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties. This provides transparency and protects officers and the agency from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner and to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances. Officers are expected to enforce criminal and motor vehicle laws using well-reasoned discretion while insisting that citizens will only be detained when there exists at a minimum, reasonable articulable suspicion that an offense has been, is being, or will be committed. Officers, as community care-takers, are also entrusted to investigate circumstances that would lead them to believe that a person is in distress or need of aid. Members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in various topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to ensure that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law.

The following aspects of officer activity are tracked and examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in warnings
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers issued approximately 1850 traffic citations in 2022. Those citations resulted from violations witnessed during routine patrol, special attention enforcement details stemming from citizen complaints, investigations of traffic crashes, as well as various other encounters between the public and officers investigating suspicious and/or criminal behaviors. Of those citations issued, 41.66% were issued to individuals identified as being white, 54.36% as being African-American, 1.61% as being Asian, and 2.37% being of other races or their race was not known or reported. Approximately, 52.21% were issued to males and 47.79% were issued to females. There were nearly 1100 warnings issued for various infractions the majority of those being verbal in nature.

The agency received no substantiated complaints of racial profiling in 2022.

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2022, 1,527 traffic and 13 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 386 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2022, Mayor's Court transferred 63 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 765 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2022, 665 people were processed in the Beachwood City Jail, 430 males and 235 females. We housed 54 inmates for the City of Pepper Pike, who contracts with the City of Beachwood for jail services. We also housed 3 people as time servers. We did not house any prisoners as mutual aid for any other non-contract departments.

Beachwood officers booked 608 people into the jail. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 68 juveniles that were processed in juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 1 juvenile was transported to their facility to be held. Juvenile arrests increased by 35 from 2021 (106%) and adult arrests increased by 102 from 2021 (18.1%). The total numbers of arrests were similar in 2020 and 2021, which are significantly down from years prior to 2020. This is contributed to the continued Covid-19 Pandemic and recent changes to arrest policies, including driving under suspension.

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail has remained relatively low since 2017.

In 2022, 54 people were housed for the City of Pepper Pike which resulted in the revenue of \$7,925.00. The housing of prisoners for other cities, with a contract or by mutual aid, will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected.

The jail was inspected in 2022 by the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, and found to be in full compliance with all of the applicable state jail standards.

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state standards. As noted above, the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, found the jail to be in full compliance. In addition, the fire department and county health officials inspected the jail and found no deficiencies. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. No staff members or inmates sustained injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

Police Mountain Bike Unit

The police mountain bicycle unit was staffed and deployed as a part time unit, use at the discretion of the Officer in Charge during regular patrol shifts and at the discretion of the Captain for special City events. Active members of the department in the unit in 2022 include: Sgt. Michael Neibecker, Det. Matthew Alandt, Ptl. Amy Dansizen, Ptl. Charlene Traub, Ptl. David Miller, Ptl. Maxwell Zugay, and Ptl. Matthew Shane. Sgt. Michael Neibecker was promoted to Sergeant on 10-07-22, limiting his ability to participate moving forward.

The unit has a focus of interacting with citizens in a positive and approachable manner, being on a bicycle in open settings lends itself to achieving that goal. Some areas of note in which extra attention was given on the bicycles include the High School, City Park, Barkwood Dog Park, religious institutions, apartment complexes, and residential side streets. The unit was also deployed for multiple City special events including Race for the Place, National Night Out, Yappy Hours, and Fall Fests.

The unit is available 24/7, officers dressed for bicycle patrol for the day do have the necessary equipment to transport their bike on their cruiser at all times for easy deployment. Officers are expected to respond to calls for service as normal within reason, some obvious limitations such as traffic enforcement, car crashes, and freeway calls do exist.

There are currently three city mountain bikes in perfect operating order and there is one trailer hitch mount to affix to SUV cruisers. One older Trek mountain bicycle could be used after minor repairs are completed. There are four "trunk mounted" racks. A purchase order request will be submitted in the Spring for an additional trailer hitch mount and a rear wheel for the inoperable Trek. While the need for a fourth bicycle would be rare, it would help in the event another one needs repaired.

The unit is valuable in crime deterrence and citizen interaction. Shift supervisors are encouraged to deploy bicycle officers under their watch as often as they are able.

Emergency Services

The EDGE Swat Team is a multi-jurisdictional team comprised of seven cities which include Beachwood, Bratenahl, Cleveland Heights, Euclid, Shaker Heights, South Euclid, and University Heights. The team currently consists of approximately 30 operators, 10 Swat medics, 4 Swat canines, 4 Marksman/Observers, and additional bomb techs and negotiators.

EDGE Swat Team Leadership

Commander Mike Janson (EPD), Assistant Commander Dave Carpenter (EPD), Assistant Commander Josh Schultz (EPD). There are five team leaders including: Mike O'Conner (SEPD), Steve Wilson (SEPD), Andrew Chenevey (SHPD), Matt Lewis (SHPD), and Marc Imbrogno (UHPD).

EDGE Swat Activity

In 2022 the EDGE Swat Team had approximately 66 deployments. Deployments include narcotics, high risk search and arrest warrants, and CAT team deployments. EDGE Swat assists both local and federal agencies. Training is also done on topics such as hostage rescue, officer down, MACTAC, and direct to threat scenarios. The EDGE Swat Team also assisted with the NBA All-Star Game and Cleveland Guardians Playoff Game(s) in Cleveland, Ohio.

Additions and Updates

In 2022 Edge Swat added seven SWAT operators. The Beachwood Bearcat (Armored Vehicle) had suspension repairs and routine maintenance, along with new window replacement in 2022. EDGE Swat also ordered a new armored vehicle which is expected to be deployed later in 2023.

Field Training Officers

The Beachwood Police Department Field Training Officer Program did not have any new hires to train in 2022. The main goal for 2022 was to convert the old curriculum into the new Lexipol based curriculum. The written tests and checklist were rewritten to cover the Lexipol policy. Field Training Officers received training through the state mandated CPT requirements.

New in 2022

The curriculum was updated with new written tests and checklists to cover the Lexipol policies. There were no new hires to train in 2022.

Challenges

The switch from the CALEA based policies to the new Lexipol policies took time to find matching policies. In 2022, three FTOs were promoted to Sergeant. The current pool of FTOs is 6 due to promotions.

Future Improvements

A job posting for FTO was recently posted for interested candidates. Those interested and selected will need to go through a training program. The evaluations questions for the FTOs will be updated. Current FTOs will receive FTO training or a legal update course in 2023.

Conclusion

The standardized training curriculum assures all FTOs are using the same policies and resources to train the new hires. It is important to keep the curriculum updated and current. The Lexipol policies are the main resource the curriculum uses to train subjects. Lexipol releases legal updates and helps the curriculum stay current with the changing legal environment. Any subject materials that Lexipol does not cover will need to be covered by other legitimate well recognized resources. Currently the other resources are comprised from the OPOTA curriculum and our inactive CALEA policies.

Recruitment

On 10/25/22, Sgt. Luis Reyna volunteered to assist in recruiting efforts for the Civil Service Examination that would take place on February 7th, 2023. The job posting was first made on October 27, 2022, with the application window starting on November 4th, 2022, and closing on January 27th, 2023. Sgt. Reyna reached out to the following police academies to request an in-person recruiting visit: Kent State Police Academy, University of Akron Police Academy, Polaris Police Academy, Tri-C Police Academy, Lakeland Police Academy, and Cleveland Heights Police Academy. Lakeland Police Academy advised that they would not have an academy until March 21st, 2023. Sgt. Reyna attended recruiting sessions for the other academies on the following dates:

University of Akron – Thursday, November 3rd (20 cadets) and Thursday, January 12th (20 cadets)

Kent State – Friday, November 18th (16 cadets)

Tri-C – Wednesday, November 9th (40 cadets)

Polaris – Monday, November 21st (18 cadets)

Cleveland Heights – Wednesday, January 18th (20 cadets)

In total, Sgt. Reyna spoke in front of approximately 134 cadets in the area.

The two sessions with the University of Akron Police Academy were with different classes. The class Sgt. Reyna visited on November 3rd graduated before the New Year. For each recruiting session, Sgt. Reyna provided each interested cadet with the recruitment flyer and test announcement flyer.

In addition to in-person recruiting, Sgt. Reyna sent e-mails to the following police academies, requesting that they send out our recruiting flyers: Wayne County Career Center, Stark State College, Medina County Career Center, Lorain Community College, EHOVE Career Center (Milan, OH), Sandusky Police Academy, Kent State Police Academy (Trumbull location). Sgt. Reyna received a confirmation response from Lorain Community College, EHOVE Career Center, Kent State Police Academy (Trumbull location).

Sgt. Reyna attempted to schedule one job fair session at Kent State University with negative results. The department stated that they never received any correspondence when Sgt. Reyna reached out to the coordinator of the event.

The department received e-mails from 11 interested candidates via the Police.Recruitment e-mail. Sgt. Reyna received voicemails from 3 interested candidates. Of these 14 interested candidates, 4 held police commissions elsewhere.

In the future, the department should continue to schedule job fair sessions which would be beneficial in garnering interest from those we would not reach in police academies. Sgt Reyna believes that taking on a second or third recruiter in this department would improve our reach at police academies, job fairs, miscellaneous recruiting events, and improve response times via email and phone.

It may be worth considering an option similar to the “National Testing Network,” or “NTN,” for future job postings. “NTN” allows candidates to upload all application requirements into a candidate profile that can be pulled by the agency with the job opening. “NTN” has testing locations throughout Ohio, including Cleveland, Parma, North Canton, and Massillon. “NTN” also allows for candidates to take their tests virtually. Tests are scheduled at the candidate’s convenience. “NTN” allows for more flexibility with timing and location for both the candidates and the department. Once a candidate has taken the test provided by “NTN” and has met all the requirements of the application, our department would receive this information and determine whether to move forward with this candidate. This flexibility in test dates, times, and locations, may lead to higher candidate numbers.

SCHOOLS

2022 Director Of Security Year End Report

This report will explain what The City of Beachwood Police Department and associated officers have accomplished in the Beachwood City School System. The report will address areas and issues that the officers are currently working to improve, and any recommendations.

Background and beginning of the program

The agreement was made between the City and the School Board for police officers to work in schools. This took effect on August 1, 2015 and was renewed as of November, 2020. It is set to expire in June 2023.

There have been four changes in officer assignment or duties, they are listed below. All of the officers have worked and rotated through all of the schools. This was done so that all of the officers would be familiar with the layout and daily operation of all of the school district buildings. Once familiarity was established, it was agreed that officers would be assigned to one building. By assigning an officer to a building, it allowed the officer to specifically know the daily operation of a building and its occupants.

While on duty, school officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, watch security cameras, monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches.

Fairmount School / B.O.E

Officers assigned to building: Officer Welch and Officer Duffy

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0800 hrs.
- 0800 – 0830 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1200 – 1230 hrs. Officers will monitor early student dismissal.
- 1445 – 1500 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.
- 1500 - 1600 hrs. Officers respond to BHS to take over the duties of dismissal from the high school officer.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at the Fairmount School Building, the situation has been very positive. All of the parents and students that we interact with have nothing but praise for police officers being at the schools. Officers have done well proactively recognizing areas of concern and addressing those issues. The front office assistant is new to that position, but has been employed with the district for years and is doing very well in her new position. The preschool staff is very cognizant of building security and are quick to report anything that is out of place. Officers are on schedule and will complete all of the State of Ohio mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates. Both officers have been with the SRO program for 2 years. Officer Duffy was assigned to Fairmount / BOE last season, Officer Welch transferred from the Middle School to Fairmount / BOE. It is my recommendation that The Beachwood Police Department continues to extend their contract as long as The Beachwood City School District chooses to renew the contract for officers in schools.

Bryden School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Todd Simpson, Officer Tim Gerding
Police officer basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0730 hrs.
- 0730 – 0745 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, and classes specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1445 – 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at Bryden School many positive changes have been made. New Principal DeGeorge is very organized and takes great concern in learning and being involved in all of the safety drills. Bryden School is in serious need of more, higher definition, security cameras as well as a more workable entry point for visitor/staff interaction. Proposals have been made to rebuild Bryden School and that project is slated to begin in late 2024. That would be a tremendous advantage from a safety and security standpoint. In the meantime, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing their attention on them. Officers at Bryden School are on schedule and will complete all of the State of Ohio mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates. Officers Simpson is new to the SRO program, but has adapted quickly and receives high accolades from Principal DeGeorge and Bryden School Staff. Officer Gerding has been working as SRO's since the beginning of the program.

Hilltop School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Jason Kehrier, Officer Pete Messina

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- 0715 – 0740 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1425 – 1445 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned to Hilltop School many positive changes have been made. The addition of officers has greatly improved the safety of students, staff, and visitors attending Hilltop. Hilltop School is in need of more, higher definition security cameras. Similar to Bryden School, Hilltop is in need of a more workable entry point for visitors/staff interaction, but as mentioned above Hilltop School is scheduled to be rebuilt. That project is slated to begin in 2026. Again, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing attention on them. Principal Reid is new to her position with the district. She is on task with the State of Ohio mandated requirements for safety drills. Hilltop School, because of the baseball fields, and setting of the park-like playground, draws a lot of after hour visitors. Although the patrol division actively patrols the school parking lot, additional security cameras would deter unwanted activity. Officer Kehrier has been with the SRO program for 1 prior season, but has adapted and fits in extremely well. Officer Messina has been with the program since its inception.

Beachwood Middle School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Anthony Thomas, Officer Rick Friedl

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0800 hrs.
- From 0800 - 0815 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1545 – 16000 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Officer Friedl is new to the SRO program but has fit in very well. Out of all of the buildings in the district, the Middle School has the most security cameras, per building size. There are high definition cameras focused on the parking lot and entry points of the school. Inside cameras are well placed and cover a majority of the school. The Middle School has already completed all of the State mandated school safety drills. Principal Srithai is doing a great job even though there has been a high number of disciplinary issues this year in comparison to previous years.

Beachwood High School

Officer assigned to the building: Officer C.J. Piro

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- From 0705 - 0830 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1445 – 1500 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.
- 1500 - 1600 Fairmount Officer covers the later than normal dismissal time for the high school.

Summary:

Beachwood High School is an extremely busy building. It hosts 3 different Excel Tecc programs bringing in students from 11 different school districts. These are vocational and learning opportunities. The school restaurant runs from mid-October until late April and is open to the public on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. This adds an additional safety concern for the building. The Principal, Mr. Chase and Assistant Principal, Ms. Erkins, have had previous experience working with Police Officer's in the schools. They have a very good understanding of when and how to involve the police. They consistently inform me of any issues. They handle all of the school matters without police interaction, but will not hesitate to involve the police when needed. The high school has completed all of the school safety drills. Since beginning work at the high school, tighter security procedures were instituted. The staff has responded well to officers in the building, and with the approval of Ms. Erkins and Mr. Chase, I continue to speak to classes about current law enforcement and school related topics. All of the evening sporting events have an officer detailed to provide security. I have now been requested to travel to away sporting events as well as chaperone school trips.

Closing

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place. Every building is more secure. New for the 2022 - 2023 school year is the purchase of safes and patrol rifles for each building in the district. Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have gone well in all of the schools. School police officers have trained "active threat drills" in our own buildings. Another improvement from the previous school year, the district has purchased additional security cameras. While most of the buildings had some of the same shortcomings relating to CCTV cameras, the purchase of new cameras demonstrates that the district takes safety and security seriously and are taking steps to remediate those issues.

All of the principals have mutual goals and are extremely easy to work with. Every building's administration has open lines of communication with the police officers. They provide feedback and ideas when implementing new security measures. I have regular cadence meetings scheduled with each principal to ensure that any concerns are being addressed and remediated.

Beachwood Police Dispatch has recorded over 55 calls for service at school district buildings. Those calls were generated from both school police officers and road officers. The 55 recorded calls also included times when officers responded to district's buildings on weekends and when school was not in session. The calls requesting a police officer were primarily service type calls (alarms, vehicle lock-outs, premise checks, rescue squad calls, etc.). Road patrol officers logged several school visits this year. The number of road patrol officers visiting the schools has increased every year since officers have been detailed to the schools. That is a very positive and needed thing. The more that patrol officers visit, the more familiar they will be with the layout and operation of the schools making the schools an overall safer place.

Having officers detailed to the schools has dramatically improved the relationship between the community and the police department. No matter what building you would observe, you would frequently see interaction between the students and the officers assigned to the buildings. At all of the schools, officers will be seen in the cafeteria during a portion of the lunch periods. Students will often ask the officers to join them for lunch. In the lower schools officers will be outside when students are on recess. In the upper schools officers are involved in classroom discussions. All of the officers have done classroom and safety presentations at all of the schools. While working sporting events it is not uncommon to see students from all of the schools introducing officers to their parents. Dr. Hardis also supports Beachwood School Officers working with officers from other school districts. The agreement to have officers detailed to the Beachwood City Schools is working well, and Officers look forward to continuing to protect and serve in the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Beachwood Police department and the City of Beachwood pride itself on its engagement with the residential and business communities. During 2022 the Beachwood police department has proactively collaborated with apartment complexes, medical institutions, and nursing care/independent living facilities. Any business interested in working with the Beachwood police department on any concerning matter can speak with the department's business liaison officer, Lt. Kevin Owens.

The Beachwood police department has ongoing collaborative relationships with apartment complexes in the city. Lt. Owens began speaking with management of The Vantage and The Vue in 2021. Those interactions expanded into 2022 with continued collaborative work, and also meeting with the management of The Hiatus, R.H. Myers, Stone Gardens, Wiggins Place, The Village community, Ahuja Hospital, the UH Beachwood Medical Center, and Beachwood Place Mall.

The Vantage is a large multi-building apartment complex. Occasionally, residents of the Vantage request police services for a variety of reasons. In meeting with The Vantage management we have discussed issues concerning parking, plowing, petty theft of packages, the parking garage height restrictors, elements of the physical property, police access to locked exterior doors, and other nuisance and quality of life issues. One of the most interesting results of this relationship was the addition of License Plate Reader cameras at the entrance and exit near the gate house. This information can be shared with law enforcement for immediate police response, to report the presence suspicious activity involving vehicles (stolen car, stolen license plate, missing persons, etc), and to provide historical data that can be used to assist in investigations as needed. The Vantage also provided the police department with access fobs to the main entrance doors for immediate access to first responders during a call for service.

The same manner of issues have been discussed with The Vue; a very large, single building apartment complex. While license plate reader cameras have been suggested to The Vue, the biggest issue requiring a police response over the past two summer seasons were disturbances at the pool within The Vue. These pool party instances were largely precipitated by trespassers (non-residents of The Vue). The Vue management worked with the City of Beachwood resulting in The Vue altering pool rules, posting signage at each pool entrance, and advising all residents and guests that The Vue management will enforce these rules for the safety of all, including police enforcement as needed. These steps curbed the disturbances. Like The Vantage, The Vue provided door access fobs and garage access strips allowing police immediate access to the building enhancing quicker response.

The Hiatus is a newer apartment property located at 3800 Park East. The collaborative relationship is new but growing, and has resulted in door access fobs being provided to the police for immediate access to the building similar to the other apartments.

Lieutenant Owens gave safety talks to several communities within the city, specifically, the nursing & independent living facilities at R. H. Myers apartments, Stone Gardens, Wiggins Place, and the gated community of The Village. The residents of those communities had specific concerns regarding the police service function to them and the buildings in which they reside. Their primary concern was their physical safety, petty theft from their rooms, and thefts or damage to their cars. Their safety was assured, their questions answered, and the residents were pleased to meet with a police official to understand how the police department functions to meet their specific needs, and the experience of dealing with an officer in a meet and greet setting.

The University Hospital Beachwood Medical Center and UH Ahuja Hospital have both met with Lt. Owens to discuss the unique nature of emergency response to a critical incident at a medical facility providing ongoing 24/7 patient care. The medical setting presents unique challenges to protect patients who are in treatment, having a procedure, in the emergency room, in recovery, within other medical departments, arriving in ambulances, and the medical teams that care for them. Discussions include the response internally to a critical event merged with the external police response, managing a critical incident while securing other elements of the medical facility, and law enforcement access to secured areas, among other concerns.

Lt. Owens has met with the security operations of Beachwood Place Mall to keep communication channels open, share ideas to increase safety, and maintain relations with the mall security personnel and the Beachwood Police Department. This had been ongoing by Police Chief McLaughlin. An outgrowth of the Chief's and Beachwood PDs relationship with Beachwood Place Mall is the mall's installation of License Plate Reader cameras at every entrance and exit of the mall. The information from the camera system sends pertinent law enforcement data directly to the computers in the police cars of on-duty officers. Police officers are able to immediately respond to suspicious circumstances related to the vehicles entering and exiting the property based on entered law enforcement data gleaned by the system.

Additionally, during 2022, Chief McLaughlin increased the police presence at Beachwood Place Mall by launching Beachwood's first ever mini-station within the mall. The police department mini-station is an office on the second level of the mall just adjacent to the food court. The Beachwood Police Department has been awarded a grant that will be used to add police staffing related to the mini-station and police service within the mall.

All of these collaborative relationships proactively combine to bring greater safety to the community and those who live, work, and visit Beachwood. These relationships will continue to grow into the future and with other locations under the direction of Chief McLaughlin during 2023.



BEACHWOOD POLICE / FIRE DISPATCH CALLS RECEIVED SUMMARY (Beachwood Police / Fire Only)


Calls Received by Day of Week and Month


