

DISPATCH

In 2021, each member of the dispatch staff completed Crisis Intervention Training hosted by the Cuyahoga County ADAMHS Board, learning skills to navigate calls from those experiencing a crisis.

In total, the dispatch center received 62,250 incoming calls with an average answer time of 2.8 seconds. 99.58% of all incoming calls were answered within 10 seconds.

Plans to incorporate additional entities into the dispatch center are still underway.

TRAFFIC

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2021 there were six hundred forty-seven (647) motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police Department. One hundred thirty-nine (139), occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were forty-seven (47) accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not feel it was a matter worth reporting to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other reasons, it was decided that a report should be filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There was a total of five hundred eight (508) on street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2021. Of the five hundred eight (508) on street accidents two hundred two (202) involved personal injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There was zero (0) fatal crashes in 2021.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in two hundred thirty-three (233) crashes. In 2021, one hundred sixty-two (162) drivers were issued citations for Failure to Maintain an Assured Clear Distance Ahead. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and it is our opinion that many crashes are directly related to driver inattention and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on sixty-nine (69) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations. A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 22 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 47 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes
- 0 citations issued for Failure to Yield to an emergency vehicle

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on sixty (60) reports.

Failure to control was listed as the causative factor on forty-four (44) reports.

Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on seventeen (17) reports.

Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on forty-nine (49) reports.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost everyday. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2021, the police department received seven hundred forty-five (745) traffic complaints (as defined above) called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as e-mail.

Applicable complaints were posted in a "traffic special attention" file and via e-mail where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2021, officers logged eighty-nine (89) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red-light violations.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2021 the Beachwood Police Department made fifty-one (51) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Thirty-nine (39) of the arrested were male violators and twelve (12) were female violators.

Twenty-seven (27) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .162 which is just over twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .243, which is just over three (3) times the legal limit. Eleven (11) persons refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Due to different reasons or circumstances, four (4) persons were requested to provide blood samples. Four (4) were found to be over the legal limit or had been using drugs of abuse.

Three (3) of the violators had at least two (2) prior conviction. Three (3) violators had more than two prior convictions. One (1) violator was charged with felony O.V.I. violations in 2021. There were two (2) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2021.

The bulk of O.V.I. arrests were made between midnight and 4:00 AM (27). The busiest days of the week for O.V.I. activity were Saturday and Sunday. The month of October had the most number of arrests with eight (8). The roadways with the highest number arrests were Richmond Rd. with fourteen (14), Chagrin with nine (9), IR 271 with eight (8), and Cedar Road with six (6).

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 1,434 traffic stops in 2021 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were three hundred twenty-six (326) speeding citations issued, one hundred sixty-two (162) assured clear distance ahead citations, forty-two (42) red light citations, ninety-three (93) vehicle registration violations, one hundred four (104) stop sign violations, and one hundred thirty-one (131) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. Three (3) citations were issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued one thousand thirty-nine (1,039) citations, forty-one (41) written warnings, and six hundred forty-two (642) verbal warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often times the officer spends 20-30 minutes and records that "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

At one time the Beachwood Police Traffic Bureau was assigned the task of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (40) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood.

The monitoring of traffic signals was done on a daily basis by a central traffic computer located in the traffic bureau. That system has been removed from the traffic bureau and is now maintained by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centracs. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to one hundred-three (103) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2021.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2021, the traffic bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2021 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company received an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Tow companies were authorized to charge \$135 for a standard tow (additional fees for extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$25 per day for storage.

In 2021 there were five hundred five (505) vehicles towed, this included forty (40) private tows. Private tows are those that the police may have called for at the request of the driver but no further police action was taken.

Forty-two (42) vehicles were unclaimed and scrapped in 2021 with numerous other vehicles still being processed to be scrapped in accordance with Ohio law.

INVESTIGATIONS

DETECTIVE BUREAU/ JUVENILE DIVISION

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau consists of five full time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. Two of the detectives are assigned to the SPEAR unit (Specialized Patrol Enforcement and Response) and work primarily late afternoon/evening hours. One of the detectives is assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau spent the majority of 2021 completing fraud, sexual assaults and other investigations that require extensive follow-up. The Detective Bureau along with the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigations, spent time and resources investigating a homicide that occurred within the City of Beachwood. This investigation is still open.

The SPEAR units consists of two detectives and two patrol officers including a K-9. This unit worked directly with the detective bureau to identify areas of concern throughout the city. The unit would then take a proactive response to not only deter crime but to quickly respond and react to anyone violating the law. This unit was frequently deployed at Beachwood Place which allowed the officers assigned to the patrol division to be available to respond to other calls for service as well as actively patrol the city.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

In 2021, there was six incidents determined to be internal affairs complaints.

Of the six complaints, four were investigated and determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department protocol. One complaint involved a part time Beachwood Police Officer that was working an off duty detail and failed to follow policy when confronting a juvenile suspect. The officer was suspended from working extra duty jobs for 30 days and issued a Letter of Reprimand.

The last complaint involved an off duty Beachwood Police Officer being arrested for the suspicion of driving while intoxicated. This case is currently pending in a court of another jurisdiction.

TRAINING

2021 was a busy training year for Beachwood Officers and Dispatchers alike. Officer Appell along with several other officers completed numerous internal trainings/re-certifications. These trainings included firearms, AED/CPR, Crisis Intervention Team, Taser, Use-of-force, Duty to Intervene, Anti-Bias, NARCAN, Ohio Ethics Laws and Trauma/First AID.

Several Beachwood Officers attended numerous external training classes during 2021 as COVID restrictions eased. Like 2020, The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission again did not mandate any hours of continuing professional training (CPT) requirements. Numerous officers are members of the Eastside Departments Enforcement Group (E.D.G.E.) teams including Mobile Field Force, S.W.A.T., Crisis Negotiators, Accident Investigation Unit & Bomb Team. The S.W.A.T. team trains 16 hours every month plus one full week per year. The other teams typically train 8 hours per month. These teams/units service six municipalities. One Beachwood Police Officer is a member of the Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team. The team meets numerous times a year for internal training. This unit services 13 municipalities.

CANINE

In 2021, both K9 teams successfully completed annual recertification in March through the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission and the North American Police Work Dog Association. Officer Gray attended a "Canines in The Courtroom" course in Elyria, OH on April 21st. This course provided a wealth of information regarding how to properly present narcotics cases involving canines. Officers Gray and Bell both attended a three day "Patrol K9 Tactics and Survival Workshop" in Bainbridge, OH on October 12th, 13th and 14th. This course increased the handler's knowledge and abilities when deploying the canines during critical incidents as well as trauma care for critically injured canines. The K9 Unit regularly attended monthly training on a bi-weekly basis throughout 2021. This training is monitored by a regional master trainer who ensures the teams maintain a standard of reliability related to patrol and detection functions.

K9 Kai was deployed a total of eight times with three narcotics detection deployments and five patrol deployments. Four of the deployments were for neighboring agencies. A total of 13.029 Kg of cocaine, 27g of heroin, and 13.1g of THC oil was located and seized. K9 Kai assisted in the arrest of three individuals.

K9 Jorik was deployed a total of ten times with two explosives detection deployments and eight patrol deployments. Two of the deployments were for neighboring agencies. K9 Jorik did not locate explosive devices on the two explosive detection deployments. K9 Jorik assisted in the arrest of two individuals.

Annual K9 In-Service training was completed throughout 2021 with nearly all active officers and supervisors of the patrol division. This training allowed patrol members to work in close quarters with the canines as they completed building searches, high-risk traffic stops and tracking scenarios. This training was highly regarded by patrol members and the K9 Unit received a fair amount of positive feedback. K9 In-Service Training will continue to be an annual goal to further increase the proficiency of handlers and patrol officers. The K9 Unit continues to be a beneficial asset to the department and the proficiency of the teams is increasing dramatically as the years go by.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel were involved in ten (10) reportable force incidents during 2021. That force was used by personnel for defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, and to affect lawful arrests. When considering the thousands of encounters agency personnel have with the public in various contexts, this number is remarkably low. Agency policy defines force as *the application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.* The definition of “reportable force” by department policy is:

An incident in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force (including canine deployment):

- *To compel a person to comply with the employee’s directions, or efforts to gain control;*
- *To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention;*
- *To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect*

When that force employed results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or “control holds” to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect’s hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Deadly force as defined by agency policy is that force which is *reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.*

A Taser conducted energy weapon was deployed in three (3) reportable use of force instances reviewed. There were no instances in which deadly force was deployed by agency personnel in 2021. In almost all cases, there were multiple officers present during each application of force.

Physical injuries to agency personnel and subjects were minor when reported, and consisted mainly of scrapes, bruises, and aggravations of prior, existing injuries. All incidents reviewed were determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while also meeting the legal standard of objective reasonableness. The following are brief descriptions of the incidents where force was applied by agency personnel and the circumstances surrounding them.

01/31/2021

Report #21003218

Officers were summoned to the city jail to assist corrections personnel with an inmate who had been confined in the jail's restraint chair due to prior combative behavior. The male had to be transferred to a holding cell due to the duration of confinement in the restraints, but was threatening and intimidating that a fight would ensue upon his release. A physical altercation resulted as he was transferred into a cell. Officers grappled with the inmate and were able to get him into the holding cell without injury to him, however a corrections officer suffered a mouth laceration as a result of the struggle.

04/07/2021

Report #21011640

Officers responded to Beachwood Place for a reported disturbance between multiple individuals. The initial arriving officer was directed by off-duty police working a security detail toward one of the incident's combatants who was trying to leave the scene. When the officer confronted the female and attempted to detain her, a struggle ensued in which she resisted. During the confrontation, a male approached the officers interfering with that arrest. When one of the officers turned to engage the male who approached, the female kicked him in the back as she struggled to pull away. The male then tried to resist arrest, and a Taser conducted energy weapon was deployed upon him as he attempted to escape from officers by crawling beneath a parked vehicle where he was believed to have dumped narcotics.

06/03/2021

Report #21018695

Patrol officers were summoned to the city jail to assist corrections personnel with a belligerent inmate who was overturning trash cans, failing to follow the orders of corrections personnel, and refusing to lock up into his individual cell. The male continued to challenge and taunt uniformed officers who eventually had to physically engage the inmate to get him into his cell. Officers used grappling techniques and knee strikes during this struggle to get the inmate into his cell.

06/14/2020

Report #21020174

Officers responded to the area of Chagrin Boulevard and IR-271 for reports of a vehicle parked and abandoned in an opposing traffic lane. Dispatch personnel were able to review traffic cameras to determine the occupants of the vehicle and their direction of travel. The parties who abandoned the vehicle moments before were located at the Shell Gas Station in Orange Village. The highly intoxicated male was discovered to be in possession of a key affiliated with the vehicle and when confronted with this information, he fled on foot. A foot chase ensued during which time Taser CEW deployments missed their mark. The male tried to flee in another vehicle after circling back to the gas station lot. Officers were able to forcibly remove the male from the vehicle, take him to the ground and used additional joint manipulation, drive stuns from the CEW, and control hold during an ensuing ground fight to get the male into custody.

06/17/2021

Report #21020730

Officers responded to Pinecrest in Orange Village for a mutual aid request assisting with a large crowd that was out-of-control and failing to disperse. An officer deployed a Pepperball launcher toward a group of young adults who had just engaged in a large physical altercation. No one was directly struck, the crowd dispersed, and no injuries were reported.

06/22/2021

Report #21021367

An officer assigned to the multi-jurisdictional EDGE SWAT unit responded with the team to a Cleveland Heights residence for a barricaded, armed subject. That male eventually exited the residence and charged officers while wielding a sword. The Beachwood officer deployed less-than lethal impact rounds as well as his Taser conducted energy weapon during the violent struggle to take the male into custody.

08/01/2021

Report #21026568

Officers located a stolen vehicle in the parking lot of Beachwood Place. Review of mall surveillance images allowed officers to identify three individuals who had arrived in the stolen vehicle. Once the subjects were located inside the mall, they were escorted back to the vehicle for additional investigation. One of the subjects attempted to flee on foot while nearing the vehicle, but was quickly apprehended and then complied. Another of the trio had to be forcibly put into the cage of a marked police car subsequent to his arrest. During his attempt to thwart officers' efforts to secure him in the prisoner compartment, he bit the inside of his own cheek while kicking at officers who were pushing and pulling him into the cruiser. Three handguns were recovered from inside the stolen vehicle.

11/10/2021

Report #21041162

Officers were alerted by Beachwood Place Security of a male trying to trespass into multiple vehicles in the parking lot. The male who appeared voluntarily intoxicated was located within Dillard's. He denied the allegations, and there was no evidence that he actually gained entry to any vehicles at that time. He was escorted from the store and asked to leave the mall complex by security. He returned to the mall in violation of an issued trespass notice and again began trying door handles. When confronted by police, he resisted arrest and had to be taken to ground where officers grappled with him eventually securing him in handcuffs.

11/21/2021

Report #21042740

Officers responded to the Shell Station on Chagrin Boulevard for a reported domestic disturbance. Upon the arrival of officers, they were directed toward an occupied vehicle in the lot from which both subjects exited. The male involved was extremely intoxicated. Following the interviews of both subjects, it was determined that the male was subject to arrest. Upon attempting to arrest the subject, he became belligerent and swung at an officer. He was taken to the ground where a ground fight ensued and eventually secured in handcuffs. He continued to attempt to kick officers and get to his feet. He was secured in a hobble device to restrain his legs and feet. It was alleged that prior to officer arrival, he had tried to run into Chagrin Boulevard with the intention of being hit by a passing car. He was conveyed by rescue squad to a local emergency room to be medically & psychologically evaluated.

12/24/2021

Report #21047553

An officer working a security detail at Saks Department store within Beachwood Place responded to a physical altercation between two mutual combatants with a crowd around them. The males refused to obey orders to cease and disperse and were ultimately subjected to a Taser conducted energy weapon deployment. Minor injuries were sustained by the combatants who were taken into custody without further incident.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

There were only two (2) incidents in 2021 that met the criteria for a vehicle pursuit. Vehicle pursuit is defined by the current agency policy as: *an event involving one or more peace officers attempting to apprehend a suspect who is trying to avoid arrest while operating a motor vehicle by using high speed or other evasive tactics, such as disregarding traffic warning signs, stop signs, red lights, driving off a roadway, turning suddenly or driving in a legal manner but willfully failing to yield to an officer's signal to stop.* Both of the agency pursuits were evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

11/23/2021

Report #21043019

An officer monitoring traffic recognized a vehicle that matched the description of a vehicle affiliated with an aggravated robbery that had occurred hours before within the City. A LEADS inquiry into the license plate revealed that the vehicle was entered stolen and associated with a kidnapping offense in a neighboring community. When officers attempted to initiate a traffic stop, the vehicle fled at a high rate of speed and a vehicle pursuit ensued. Pursuing officers lost sight of the vehicle after the pursuit was well into the City of Shaker Heights and the pursuit was abandoned.

12/31/2021

Report #21048461

Beachwood patrol officers were notified by radio that an on-going pursuit of a motor vehicle was approaching City limits. The vehicle pursued was taken during the murder of an off-duty police officer hours prior. Officers from this agency engaged and joined the pursuing police unit as it traveled northbound on Richmond Road. The Beachwood officer that remained engaged in the pursuit terminated after losing sight of the subject vehicle and pursuing police unit in the City of Lyndhurst.

ILLEGAL PROFILING REPORT

A fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States to all who live in this nation is the equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. Citizens are free to walk and drive our streets, highways, and other public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. They also are entitled to be free from crime, and from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This law enforcement agency is charged with protecting these fundamental rights for all, regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, age, physical or mental handicap, religion or other belief system, and/or classification or group affiliation.

The purpose of the illegal profiling policy is to unequivocally state that illegal profiling in law enforcement is totally unacceptable, to provide guidelines for officers to prevent such occurrences, and to protect our officers from unwarranted accusations when they act within the dictates of the law and agency policy & procedures. Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties to provide transparency and protect themselves from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner, to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances, and to actively enforce the motor vehicle laws, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe they have committed, are committing, or are about to commit an infraction of the law or when the situation leads an officer to believe that a person may need some type of assistance. To that end, members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in various topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion or police action is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to verify that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law.

The following aspects of officer activity were examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in warnings
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers issued approximately 1039 citations in 2021. This total is reflective of efforts to practice social distancing and limit unnecessary officer exposures at various times throughout the year. The issued citations resulted from traffic stops, responses to and investigations of traffic crashes, investigations into criminal and suspicious matters, as well as other law enforcement encounters. Of those citations, 43.40% were issued to individuals identified as being white, 52.74% as being African-American, approximately 1.44% as being Asian, and 2.40% as being of other races or their race was not known or reported by the issuing officer. Of those citations issued, 52.06% were issued to males and 47.93% were issued to females. There were nearly 800 total warnings issued for various infractions. The majority of those were verbal in nature.

The agency received no substantiated complaints of racial profiling in 2021.

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2021, 880 traffic and 19 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 496 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2021, Mayor's Court transferred 59 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 575 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2021, 563 people were processed in the Beachwood City Jail, 368 males and 195 females. We housed 30 people for the City of Pepper Pike who contracts with the City of Beachwood for jail services. We also housed 3 people as time servers and an additional 14 people for other cities on a mutual aid basis.

Beachwood officers arrested 516 people for crimes in Beachwood. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 33 juveniles that were processed in juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 3 of those juveniles were transported to their facility. Juvenile arrests decreased by 21 from 2020 and adult arrests increased by 27 from 2020. The total number of arrests were similar in 2019 and 2020 which are significantly down from years past. This is contributed to the continued Covid-19 Pandemic.

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail has remained relatively constant since 2017.

In 2021, 30 people were housed for the City of Pepper Pike which resulted in the revenue of \$6,220.00. The housing of prisoners for other cities, with a contract or by mutual aid, will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected.

The jail was inspected in 2021 by the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, and found to be in full compliance with all of the applicable state jail standards.

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state standards. As noted above, the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, found the jail to be in full compliance. In addition, the fire department and county health officials inspected the jail and found no deficiencies. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. No staff members or inmates sustained serious injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

Police Mountain Bike Unit

The police mountain bicycle unit was staffed in 2021 as a part time unit deployed at the discretion of the daily patrol shift officer in charge. Personnel changes in the last year include one officer relinquishing their assignment to the unit voluntarily and one officer resigning from their employment with the City as a police officer. Four new officers were appointed to the Mountain Bicycle Unit and all of these newly appointed officers have received the proper training and certification to take part in the unit. In addition, the unit supervisor has also been reassigned to uniformed patrol and will be capable of supplementing the unit for bicycle patrol when manpower allows.

The unit has continued to focus on areas of the City where the likelihood of citizen interaction is highest, including but not limited to City Parks, walking/riding trails, the Family Aquatic Center and associated playground areas, schools, and Beachwood Place Mall. The unit assists with special events in the City where large public gatherings are expected and takes part in residential street patrol.

The unit operates on a 24-hour and seven day a week availability as weather permits. Officers assigned to the unit are able to transport the bicycle on their cruiser for easy deployment, or can choose to start patrol from the police station. While on bicycle patrol, officers are expected to respond to assigned and self-initiated activity in the same manner as they normally would with the notable exception of not responding to IR271 on a bicycle.

All of the city owned bicycles are in proper working order. The unit continues to be a valuable tool for the department especially with regard to positive public interaction and a visible deterrent to criminal activity.

Emergency Services

The EDGE SWAT TEAM is a multi-jurisdictional team comprised of seven cities: Beachwood, Shaker Heights, Euclid, Cleveland Heights, South Euclid, University Heights, and Bratenahl. The team currently consists of 30 Operators, 10 SWAT Medics, 4 SWAT Canines, 4 Marksman/Observers, 6 Bomb Technicians, and 10 Crisis Negotiators.

EDGE SWAT TEAM Leadership

Commander Rick Friedl (SEPD), Assistant Commander Mike Janson (EPD), Head Team Leader/Training Coordinator Dave Carpenter (EPD), Team Leader Josh Schultz (EPD)

In 2021 the EDGE SWAT TEAM had 60 deployments, 10 of these were armed barricaded subjects. Deployments also included narcotics and high risk search and arrest warrants assisting local and federal agencies. Criminals wanted for crimes such as rape, felonious assault, and homicide. The EDGE SWAT TEAM also assisted with the NFL Draft held in Cleveland, Ohio.

In 2021 EDGE SWAT added a trained six-man Tactical Explosive Breaching Element to the teams capabilities. This additional tactic is beneficial in numerous situations for breaching or for a distraction technique.

Field Training Officers

The Beachwood Police Department Field Training Officer Program trained six new lateral transfer officers in 2021. The program incorporated nine Field Training Officers into the training program. The program utilized the traditional four phases of field training with a two week orientation to start the probationary officers' career at Beachwood Police Department. The entire program expanded over approximately twelve weeks.

New in 2021

The program featured a new standardized training curriculum. For the first time, the curriculum contained tests on important subjects, and the curriculum gave the FTO specific guidance on what resources to cover in regards to the subject materials trained. The program concluded with an anonymous evaluation on each FTO. Each probationary officer was asked to complete an anonymous evaluation on each training officer. These evaluations were discussed with each FTO.

Challenges

During the training program, Lexipol policies were implemented, but the old policies were still in effect as the transition occurred. The training curriculum had to be changed to include the new Lexipol policies and FTOs had to cover both policies. The tests were based off the old policies and were not changed. The tests and training resources had to be edited as mistakes were found during the training. The Lexipol policies were fully implemented after the probationary officers finished their training program.

Future Improvements

The training curriculum needs to be updated for the new Lexipol policies, and the tests need to be created for the new Lexipol policies. The FTO evaluations need to be updated as well as the probationary quarterly evaluations. Those evaluations were not updated in 2021 and are in need of an update.

Conclusion

The program seemed to run smoothly even with the new training curriculum. The program was able to accommodate 5 probationary officers at one time. More than five probationary officers could tax the efficiency of overseeing the program. Nine FTOs allowed the leeway to cover vacation time and other absences without heavily leaning on none FTOs to train the probationary officers.

SCHOOLS

This report will explain what The City of Beachwood Police Department and associated Officers have accomplished in the Beachwood City School System. The report will address areas and issues that the Officers are currently working to improve, and any recommendations.

Background and beginning of the program

The agreement was made between the City and the School Board for police officers to work in schools. This took effect on August 1, 2015 and was renewed as of November ,2020. There have been four changes in officer assignment or duties, they are listed below. All of the officers have worked and rotated through all of the schools. This was done so that all of the officers would be familiar with the layout and daily operation of all of the School District's buildings. Once familiarity was established, it was agreed that officers would be assigned to one building. By assigning an officer to a building this allowed the officer to specifically know the daily operation of a building and its occupants. While on duty school officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, watch security cameras, monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches. With all due respect and clarity, it would take too much time and space to list everything that officers do, have done, or are willing to do while working at the schools.

Fairmount School / B.O.E

Officers assigned to building: Officer Holmes and Officer Duffy

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0730 hrs.
- 0745 – 0830 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1200 – 1230 hrs. Officers will monitor early student dismissal.
- 1515 – 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary: Since officers have been assigned at the Fairmount School Building, the situation has been very positive. All of the parents and students that we interact with have nothing but praise for police officers being at the schools. Officers have done well proactively recognizing areas of concern and addressing those issues. The front office assistant and the preschool staff are very cognizant of building security and are quick to report anything that is out of place. Officers are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates. Both officers are new to the SRO program but have adapted very well and are an excellent addition to Beachwood Police.

Bryden School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Tom Powers, Officer Tim Gerding

Police officer basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0715 hrs.
- 0730 – 0745 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, and classes specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1445 – 1515 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary: Since officers have been assigned at Bryden School many positive changes have been made. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are organized and take great concern over all of the safety drills. Bryden School is in serious need of more, higher definition, security cameras as well as a more workable entry point for visitor/staff interaction. Proposals have been made to consolidate Bryden and Hilltop with Fairmount School making one big elementary school. That would be a tremendous advantage from a safety and security standpoint. In the meantime, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing their attention on them. Officers at Bryden School are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates. Officers Powers and Gerding have been working as SRO's since the beginning of the program. They are valued employees.

Hilltop School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Jason Kehrier, Officer Pete Messina

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- 0715 – 0740 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1425 – 1445 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary: Since officers have been assigned to Hilltop School many positive changes have been made. The addition of officers has greatly improved the safety of students, staff, and visitors attending Hilltop. Hilltop School is in need of more, higher definition security cameras. Similar to Bryden School, Hilltop is in need of a more workable entry point for visitors/staff interaction, but as mentioned above I am hopeful for a consolidation. Again, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing attention on them. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are on task with the State mandated requirements for safety drills. Hilltop School, because of the baseball fields, and setting of the park-like playground, draws a lot of after hour visitors. Although the patrol division actively patrols the school parking lot, additional security cameras would deter unwanted activity. Officer Kehrier is new to the SRO program but has adapted and fit in well. Officer Messina has been with the program since its inception. He is a valued member of the Department.

Middle School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Anthony Thomas, Officer Dennis Welch

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0800 hrs.
 - From 0800 - 0815 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
 - Patrol school grounds
 - Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
 - Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1545 – 16000 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary: Several changes have been applied to the Middle School this year. School hours were adjusted. Officer Thomas was the lone officer assigned to the Middle School in 2021. Officer Welch is new to the SRO program but has fit in well. On Officer Thomas' day's off, other officers fill in to cover the Middle School. Out of all of the buildings in the district, the Middle School has the most security cameras, per building size. There are high definition cameras focused on the parking lot and entry points of the school. Inside cameras are well placed and cover a majority of the school. The Middle School has already completed all of the State mandated school safety drills.

High School

Officer assigned to the building: Officer C.J. Piro

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0800 hrs.
 - From 0805 - 0830 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
 - Patrol school grounds
 - Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
 - Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1445 – 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary: Beachwood High School is an extremely busy building. It hosts 3 different Excel Tecc programs bringing in students from several different school districts. These vocational and learning opportunities, while all three programs are still running, the school restaurant was closed due to the covid pandemic. The Principal, Mr. Chase and Assistant Principal, Ms. Erkins, have had previous experience working with a Police Officer in the schools. They have a very good understanding of when and how to involve the police. . They consistently inform me of any issues. They handle all of the school matters without police interaction, but will not hesitate to involve the police when needed. The high school has completed all of the school safety drills. Since beginning work at the high school, tighter security procedures were instituted. The staff has responded well to officers in the building, and with the approval of Ms. Erkins and Mr. Chase, I continue to speak to classes about current law enforcement and school related topics. All of the evening sporting events have an officer detailed to provide security. Officers have now been requested to travel to away sporting events as well as chaperone school trips. The only area of concern is that hours of operation of the High School, 7a-4p,

are longer than the contracted hours that officers are paid to work. There is a gap in coverage time that needs to be addressed and adjusted for in the next contract.

Closing

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place. Every building is more secure. Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have gone well in all of the schools. School Police Officers have trained "active threat drills" in our own buildings. As an improvement from the previous school year, the district has purchased security cameras. While most of the buildings had some of the same shortcomings relating to CCTV cameras, the purchase of new cameras demonstrates that the District takes safety and security seriously and are taking steps to remediate those issues.

All of the principals have mutual goals and are extremely easy to work with. Every building's administration has open lines of communication with the police officers. They provide feedback and ideas when implementing new security measures. I have regular cadence meetings scheduled with each principal to ensure that any concerns are being addressed and remediated.

Beachwood Police Dispatch has recorded over 70 CR (calls responded to) incidents at school district buildings. Those calls were generated from both school police officers and road officers. The 70 recorded calls also included times when officers responded to District's buildings on weekends and when school was not in session. The calls requesting a police officer were primarily service type calls (alarms, vehicle lock-outs, premise checks, rescue squad calls, etc.). Road patrol officers logged several school visits this year. The number of road patrol officers visiting the schools has increased every year since officers have been detailed to the schools. That is a very positive and needed thing. The more that patrol officers visit, the more familiar they will be with the layout and operation of the schools making the schools an overall safer place.

Having officers detailed to the schools has dramatically improved the relationship between the community and the police department. No matter what building you would observe, you would frequently see interaction between the students and the officers assigned to the buildings. At all of the schools, officers will be seen in the cafeteria during a portion of the lunch periods. Students will often ask the officers to join them for lunch. In the lower schools officers will be outside when students are on recess. In the upper schools officers are involved in classroom discussions. All of the officers have done classroom and safety presentations at all of the schools. While working sporting events it is not uncommon to see students from all of the schools introducing officers to their parents. Dr. Hardis also supports Beachwood School Officers working with officers from other school districts.

The covid pandemic has dramatically affected the operation of the schools, but officers have adapted well. The hours of operation for the Board of Education / Fairmount PreSchool, Bryden Elementary School, and Hilltop Elementary School were changed so some adjustments had to be made by all of the officers. My current staff and I have been very flexible.

The agreement to have officers detailed to the Beachwood City Schools is working well, and Officers look forward to continuing to protect and serve in the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

THE MISSION FOR EVERY MEMBER OF THE BEACHWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT IS TO CONSISTENTLY SEEK AND FIND WAYS TO AFFIRMATIVELY PROMOTE, PRESERVE AND DELIVER A FEELING OF SECURITY, SAFETY AND QUALITY SERVICES TO MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

The Beachwood Police Department's community policing efforts play an important role in delivering "a feeling of security, safety and quality services to members of our community." When personnel provide services that may be oriented towards safety and security matters, educational or related to crime prevention and community relations, they are helping their customers feel more secure as well as more appreciative of the work of their public servants. These kinds of actions can lead to increased trust and harmony between police personnel and the public they serve. This mission was completed successfully in many ways. -

The Community Engagement Officer in 2021 was Officer Jamey Appell who was assisted by many members of the department throughout the year. There were 21 community-policing events documented in 2021. ALICE (Active Threat Training) presentations continued in 2021 which were instructed by Officer Appell. Unlike 2020, all of these presentations were held in-person. Active shooter/threat events are still a real concern for the public and private sectors within the community. Other events were The Gathering Place Parade, National Night Out, Honkin' Haulin' Parade, Veteran's Day ceremonies at the City Cemetery and Operation Safe Halloween. Officer Appell was the keynote speaker at the Rotary Club of Cleveland's monthly luncheon. The topic was in reference to the difficulties of policing in the 21st century.

The Beachwood Police Facebook page was utilized again to provide members of the community with PSA's and important information. Instagram and Twitter feeds were used more extensively as well as the Cuyahoga County CODE RED/Ready Notify System.



Calls Received by Month and Shift For 2021






